## Oklahoma Employment Report -May 2005

## ATTENTION

## IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING LABOR FORCE ESTIMATES

As we informed you last month, the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) recently notified all states that inputs provided for calculating Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS) were in error. Due to this problem, the Economic Research \& Analysis division was required to re-calculate all sub-state (metropolitan statistical area, county, and city) labor force estimates for 2000, 2001, 2004 and 2005, including civilian labor force, number employed, number unemployed, and unemployment rate. Statewide estimates for these years ARE NOT affected. May 2005 statewide data is included on page 2 of this report. The error affected all states, not just Oklahoma.

BLS has scheduled the release date of this re-calculated data for Thursday, June 30. An additional news release detailing this data for Oklahoma will be published and released on this date. Re-calculated data for periods other than May 2005 will also be available on our website (www.oesc.state.ok.us/lmi) as well as the BLS website (www.bls.gov). ## LEISURE \& HOSPITALITY

乞 1,800 jobs over month

With the exception of MANUFACTURING, all industries reported over-the-year growth in May 2005. A majority of this growth was provided by the SERVICE PROVIDING INDUSTRIES, which has improved by 2.0 percent since May 2004.

LEISURE \& HOSPITALITY reported seasonal growth of 1,800 jobs (+1.4 percent) in May. Over three-quarters of this growth came from the Accommodation \& Food Services sector. This sector contributed 1,200 of 1,700 jobs gained over the year.

## IN A NUTSHELL . . .

"From April to May, growth in the Service Providing Industries was slow, resulting in a larger-than-normal increase in unemployment. This over-the-month unemployment spike wasn't serious enough to affect the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate. Although the year-overyear comparison remained healthy in May, growth in TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT for the period was the weakest it has been since 1986." - Lynn Gray, OESC Chief Economist

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## STATE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE RISES FOR FIRST TIME SINCE JANUARY

Oklahoma's State Unemployment Rate rose by three-tenths of a percent in May to reach 4.5 percent. This jump follows three consecutive months of unemployment rate drops.

The reason for the spike in the unemployment rate is the addition of 6,089 people (+8.5 percent) to the state's Non-seasonally Adjusted Unemployment over the month. Statewide Non-seasonally Adjusted Employment and Non-seasonally Adjusted Labor Force both held relatively steady in May, with the former dropping 2,303 people (-0.1 percent), and the latter adding 3,786 (+0.2 percent).

## STATE ADDS MORE THAN 25,000 JOBS FOR THE YEAR IN MAY 2005

Oklahoma's TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT gained 5,100 jobs (+0.3 percent) in May 2005, stretching its over-the-year gain to 25,500 jobs (+1.7 percent). Both the Goods Producing Industries and the Service Providing Industries added jobs for the month and year. In fact, the only industries to report losses for the month were Manufacturing and Education and Health Services (-200 jobs and -400 jobs, respectively). Both of these over-the-month losses can be attributed to seasonal factors.

## NATURAL RESOURCES \& MINING CONTINUES RECOVERY IN MAY

In May, Natural Resources and Mining gained jobs once again, adding 500 jobs (+1.6 percent) over the month. The growth was concentrated in the non-MSA portions of the state, which provide nearly 55 percent of all jobs in this industry. Over the past year, Natural Resources and Mining has grown by almost 4 percent (+1,200 jobs).

## SEASONAL FACTORS DRIVE STATE CONSTRUCTION OVER MONTH

Construction across the state also continued to grow in May, as the industry added 600 jobs (+1.0 percent) over the month due to seasonal factors. This industry is up by 700 jobs (+1.1 percent) compared to May 2004. Statewide Construction recorded growth across all sectors in May, but Specialty Trade Contractors stood out as the big mover with a gain of 400 jobs ( +1.0 percent) for the month and 600 jobs (+1.6 percent) for the year.

## LOSSES IN NON-DURABLE GOODS HOLD MANUFACTURING BACK

Statewide Manufacturing dropped 200 jobs ( -0.1 percent) over the month, as losses in the Nondurable Goods sector outweighed gains by Durable Goods. Despite Durable Goods adding 500 jobs (+0.5 percent) since May 2004, Manufacturing came in 1,100 jobs shy of its May 2004 employment level due to the Non-durable Goods sector.

## MAY MANUFACTURING ADDS JOBS AS WHOLESALE TRADE GROWS

## FINANCIAL ACTIVITIES INDUSTRY CONTINUES TO IMPROVE IN MAY

Financial Activities added 300 jobs (+0.4 percent) in May to reach 85,800 , a gain of 1,400 jobs (+1.7 percent) over the year. The monthly and yearly gains were provided mostly by the Real Estate, Rental and Leasing sector, which gained 400 jobs (+1.7 percent) for the month and 900 jobs (+3.9 percent) for the year. The Finance \& Insurance sector (+500 jobs) also contributed to the annual gain.

## PROFESSIONAL \& BUSINESS SERVICES GROWS OVER MONTH \& YEAR

In May, Professional and Business Services reported gains of 700 jobs (+0.4 percent) for the month and 7,500 jobs (+4.7 percent) for the year. Most of the monthly gain was provided by the Administrative and Support Services sector, where Employment Services added 500 jobs (+1.0 percent) for the month and 2,700 jobs (+5.8 percent) over the year. ## ADMIN. \& SUPPORT SERVICES PROVIDES MUCH OF MAY GROWTH
