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♣ 20,850 jobs (-29.5%) over year across the state dropped by nearly one-third to 70,800 people. This drop is in line with a corresponding dip in the unemployment rate over the past year.

GOVERNMENT provided more than one-quarter of the annual growth seen across the state in December 2004. With an addition of 5,700 jobs (+3.4%) over the past year, LOCAL GOVERNMENT provided a majority of the gain.

During the December-to-December period, the number of UNEMPLOYED

Hiring for the holiday shopping season pushed the RETAIL TRADE sector to gain 2.900 jobs in December. Despite expectations that the 2004 holiday

season would bring more hiring in this sector, RETAIL TRADE only

managed to improve by 300 jobs (+0.2%) over the year.

#### IN A NUTSHELL . . .

"December turned out to be a mixed bag as far as employment is concerned. Although Retail Trade didn't grow over the year as much as many hoped it would, the number of unemployed in Oklahoma plummeted over the year, and the Goods Producing Industries and Service Providing Industries have both grown by at least 1.5 percent compared to last December. This points to slow, steady growth across the state, growth that will hopefully continue in the coming months." – Lynn Gray, OESC Managing Economist

All information contained within this document is available free of charge on the OESC website (www.oesc.state.ok.us/lmi/) and through publications developed by the ER&A division. <u>Unless otherwise noted</u>, <u>all statistics are preliminary</u> <u>and have not been adjusted for seasonal factors</u>. All data is collected under strict guidelines provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Although a large amount of data has been presented through the included tables, this is in no way meant to suggest that all data has been included. Due to space restrictions, only relevant industries and subsectors have been included for each geographic area.

#### NUMBER OF UNEMPLOYED SHRINKS ALMOST ONE-THIRD OVER YEAR

Oklahoma's **Non-seasonally Adjusted Unemployment** followed up November's 1,200-person drop with a substantial loss of 5,000 people (-7.0 percent) in December 2004. This drop brought the state's **Non-seasonally Adjusted Unemployment** to 70,800 in the final month of 2004. From December 2003 to December 2004, the number of unemployed in Oklahoma dropped by nearly 30 percent (-20,850 people).

The state labor force and employment numbers also dropped in December, although both losses were minor. Oklahoma's **Non-seasonally Adjusted Labor Force** dropped by 14,200 persons (-0.8 percent) over the month, and **Non-seasonally Adjusted Total Employment** shed 9,200 people (-0.6 percent).

The result of this activity was reflected in the December **State Unemployment Rate** as a two-tenths drop to 4.2 percent. Although this is only a slight drop from the past few months, it is improvement of 1.3 percent over the year.

#### **DECEMBER UNEMPLOYMENT RATES DROP IN LARGEST MSAs**

Three of the four Oklahoma MSAs managed improvements in their unemployment rates in December. The unemployment rate for the **Oklahoma City MSA** dropped by two-tenths of a percent to 3.7 percent. **Tulsa MSA** improved by three-tenths of a percent to 4.2 percent, matching the state unemployment rate. **Lawton** also lost two-tenths to reach 3.7 percent. The **Enid MSA** held steady over the month at 2.9 percent.

The good news is that these counties all improved by at least 0.5 percent over their November 2004 rates.


#### **ROGER MILLS COUNTY REPORTS STATE'S LOWEST RATE IN DECEMBER**

**Roger Mills County** (1.2 percent) and **Harper County** (1.6 percent) both held steady in December to remain in the top three lowest county unemployment rates. A major shift in **Cimarron County** bumped it out of the top spot, allowing **Dewey County** to move into the top three after dropping to 1.4 percent over the month.

#### STATE EMPLOYMENT CONTINUES TO IMPROVE FOR MONTH, YEAR

Oklahoma's TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT added 3,000 jobs (+0.2 percent) in December, bringing its over-the-year gain to 24,600 jobs (+1.7 percent). Despite holding steady for the month, the Goods Producing Industries have gained 3,500 jobs (+1.5 percent) over the year thanks to a shared contribution of the Natural Resources and Mining and Construction industries. In the Service Providing Industries, Trade, Transportation and Utilities drove over-the-month growth by adding 3,200 jobs (+1.1 percent) due to seasonal gains in Retail Trade. Many of the 21,100 jobs gained over the year were provided by Professional and Business Services, Educational and Health Services, Leisure and Hospitality, and Government.

# STATEWIDE CONSTRUCTION CONTINUES TO GROW OVER YEAR

Despite dropping 300 jobs (-0.5 percent) over the month as winter weather arrived, **Construction** across the state has grown by 2,000 jobs (+3.3 percent) since December 2003. The **Construction of Buildings** sector provided a majority of the over-the-month growth, although all sectors contributed to the gain.

#### DURABLE GOODS MANUFACTURING SHOWS GROWTH OVER YEAR

Statewide **Manufacturing** held steady over the month as opposing shifts in **Durable Goods** and **Non-durable Goods** cancelled each other out. The industry reported 700 jobs less (-0.5 percent) than in December 2003. The **Durable Goods** sector reported growth in the amount of 600 jobs (+0.6 percent) over the year, while **Non-durable Goods** dropped 1,300 jobs (-2.6 percent).

# SEASONAL RETAIL TRADE GROWTH LEADS TO GAIN FOR MONTH

Seasonal growth in **Retail Trade** continued to drive **Trade, Transportation and Utilities** in December. At 284,600 jobs, this industry gained 3,200 jobs (+1.1 percent) over the month due mostly to holiday hiring. Over the year, this industry has gained 900 jobs (+0.3 percent), all of which were provided by the **Transportation**, **Warehouse and Utilities** sector.

# **PROFESSIONAL & BUSINESS SERVICES POSTS HEALTHY GAIN FOR YEAR**

Professional and Business Services continued to follow a pattern of small monthly ups-and-downs in December by dropping 600 jobs (-0.4 percent) following a small gain in November. The Professional, Scientific and Technical Services sector provided the only monthly growth in the industry. Over the year, Professional and Business Services has gained 5,000 jobs (+3.3 percent) provided mostly by Professional, Scientific and Technical Services and Administrative and Support Services. The Employment Services subsector actually

dropped more jobs than the industry lost over the month and has gained 4,000 jobs (+10.3 percent) since December 2003, helping drive over-the-year industry gains.

# EDUCATIONAL & HEALTH SERVICES ADDS JOBS OVER YEAR

Despite holding steady for the month, **Educational and Health Services** added 3,600 jobs (+2.0 percent) over the year, more than double last month's annual gain for the industry. The **Health Care and Social Assistance** sector provided all industry growth in December, growing by 800 jobs (+0.5 percent) over the month and 5,200 jobs (+3.3 percent) over the year. **Ambulatory Health Care** and **Hospitals** added 2,400 jobs (+4.4 percent) and 1,100 jobs (+2.4 percent), respectively.

# LEISURE & HOSPITALITY INDUSTRY GROWS OVER YEAR

Leisure and Hospitality lost 500 jobs (-0.4 percent) in December, but finished 4,000 jobs (+3.3 percent) higher than in December 2003. Over the year, Art, Entertainment and Recreation grew by 1,700 jobs (+15.2 percent), as Accommodation and Food Services gained 2,300 jobs (-2.1 percent). Annual growth in Food Services and Drinking Places accounted for all of the annual gains in Accommodation and Food Services.

The **Service Providing Industries** added 1,900 jobs (+2.1 percent) over the month thanks to **Trade, Transportation and Utilities**. A majority of the annual growth was provided by the following sectors: **Trade, Transportation and Utilities** (+3,000), **Professional and Business Services** (+3,000), **Educational and Health Services** (+1,300), and **Leisure and Hospitality** (+1,500).
