Oklahoma Employment Report - September 2005

IMPORTANT NOTICE

In January 2005, the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) introduced a new statistical model to calculate unemployment rates for state and local areas. Under this new methodology, Oklahoma's labor statistics have the potential to be affected by regional occurrences. Hurricanes Katrina and Rita both fall into this group. Some states in our region were directly hit by the hurricanes, while other states, such as Oklahoma, received evacuees from the hardest hit areas. This, in turn, affected the September labor statistics for our state. In Oklahoma, it forced the state and affected local areas to register higher-than-normal unemployment. In the coming months, regular revisions will be made to the monthly statistics, and a clearer picture of the hurricanes' effects will emerge. It is important to note that this affects only the Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS) program, which produces employment, unemployment, labor force, and unemployment rates. The Current Employment Statistics (CES) program that calculates industrial employment figures has NOT been affected.

AREAS OF INTEREST

EMPLOYMENT GROWTH	Aggressive growth continues in Natural Resources & Mining , Professional & Scientific Services , and Local Government . Over the year, these sectors saw employment grow at over twice the rate of the whole state. Even though this group makes up less than 20% of Oklahoma's total nonfarm employment, they accounted for over 40% of our net over-the-year job gain.
TULSA MSA ① 1.53% over year	Tulsa MSA continues to gain traction in its labor market recovery. In the Service Providing Industries , Tulsa posted its largest annual growth rate in over four years. Service Providing Industries growth was strong, with particular strength in the Education Services sector and the Professional & Business Services industry.
OKLAHOMA CITY MSA	By contrast, Oklahoma City MSA seems to have lost some of its momentum. For the first time in several years, the area's annual growth rate was surpassed by the Tulsa MSA. One factor contributing to the slower growth is a weak showing in Manufacturing .

Due to space restrictions, only relevant industries and subsectors have been included for each geographic area.

STATE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE RISES AS SUMMER DRAWS TO A CLOSE

Oklahoma's **State Unemployment Rate** gained half a percent to reach 4.7 percent in September. This rate increase was the result of the **Non-seasonally Adjusted Employment** and **Non-seasonally Adjusted Labor Force** shedding people, while **Non-seasonally Adjusted Unemployment** gained more than 10 percent over the month.

The state's **Non-seasonally Adjusted Employment** dropped 18,290 persons (-1.1 percent) from its ranks over the month. At the same time, **Non-seasonally Adjusted Labor Force** lost 9,190 persons (-0.5 percent). Although these numbers are down over the month, they are actually higher than in September 2004. **Employment** has grown by 1.2 percent, and **Labor Force** has added 1.6 percent over the year.

The **Non-seasonally Adjusted Unemployment** for the state grew by 9,090 persons (+12.5 percent) over the month. Over the past year, **Unemployment** has added 8,033 people (+10.9 percent).

ALL MSA UNEMPLOYMENT RATES UP OVER MONTH

Unemployment rates for all three of Oklahoma's MSAs rose in September, reflecting the change seen for the state as a whole. No MSA gained less than half of a percent over the month. The **Oklahoma City MSA** unemployment rate went from 4.0 percent to 4.5 percent. **Tulsa MSA** added six-tenths of a percent to reach 4.7 percent. The **Lawton MSA** rate expanded by eight-tenths of a percent to 5.2 percent for September.

OKFUSKEE COUNTY REPORTS HIGHEST COUNTY RATE IN SEPTEMBER

Okfuskee County's 8.2 percent unemployment rate was the state's highest county rate for the fourth consecutive month. **McCurtain County** was second at 7.9 percent, a jump of 1.6 percent over the month. **Hughes County** reported the state's third highest unemployment rate at 7.4 percent for September.



ROGER MILLS COUNTY REPORTS STATE'S LOWEST COUNTY RATE AGAIN; THREE COUNTIES TIE FOR THIRD LOWEST RATE

Despite gaining seven-tenths of a percent over the month, **Roger Mills County** held the state's lowest county unemployment rate in September at 3.0 percent. **Ellis County** was second for the month at 3.1 percent. Three counties tied for the state's third lowest rate of 3.4 percent; they were **Harper**, **Major** and **Washita** counties. Each of the three gained at least four-tenths of a percent over the month.

SEASONAL GAINS LEAD STATE TO MONTHLY GROWTH IN SEPTEMBER

Oklahoma's **TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** added 11,800 jobs (+0.8 percent) over the month and 23,700 jobs (+1.6 percent) over the year for September 2005. All of the monthly growth and most of the annual growth was contributed by the **Service Providing Industries**. The **Goods Producing Industries**, driven by seasonal losses in **Construction**, shed 700 jobs in September.

The Service Providing Industries were also seasonally driven in September. While Leisure & Hospitality managed to drop 2,300 jobs (-1.7 percent) as the summer vacation season drew to a close, other industries, such as Education & Health Services (+1,000 jobs) and Government (+15,800 jobs), reflected the return of public school and university personnel.

Over the year, the **Service Providing Industries** contributed most of the gains, as many of its industries experienced growth of around or above 2 percent.

STATEWIDE NATURAL RESOURCES & MINING ADDS JOBS OVER YEAR

Although it held steady in September, **Natural Resources & Mining** has added 1,200 jobs (+3.8 percent) over the year. The **Support Activities for Mining** sector contributed 500 jobs to the annual gain.

SEASONAL SLOWDOWN TAKES TOLL ON CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY IN SEPTEMBER

Construction began its yearly slowdown in September, as the industry shed 1,200 jobs (-1.8 percent) over the month. The **Specialty Trade Contractors** sector took the biggest hit, dropping nearly 3 percent of its jobs over the month. For the year, **Construction** has grown by 800 jobs (+1.3 percent).

STATEWIDE MANUFACTURING ADDS JOBS IN SEPTEMBER

Statewide **Manufacturing** added 500 jobs (+0.4 percent) in September, as the **Non-durable Goods** sector grew by 700 jobs (+1.5 percent). Annual gains in **Durable Goods** overcame losses in **Non-durable Goods**, resulting in a negligible over-the-year addition.

RETAIL TRADE LEADS INDUSTRY TO YEAR-OVER-YEAR GROWTH

The **Trade**, **Transportation & Utilities** industry reported annual growth of 5,200 jobs (+1.9 percent) in September. The small monthly gain was shared between the **Wholesale Trade** and **Retail Trade** sectors, as was the annual gain. **Retail Trade** provided most of the annual gain with a contribution of 4,100 jobs (+2.5 percent).

FINANCIAL ACTIVITIES SEES STRONG GROWTH OVER YEAR IN SEPTEMBER

Despite dropping 700 jobs (-0.8 percent) for the month, **Financial Activities** reported growth of 1,100 jobs (+1.3 percent) compared to September 2004. The **Finance & Insurance** sector provided all of this annual growth, as **Real Estate, Rental & Leasing** contributed nearly three-fourths of the over-the-month loss.

ANNUAL GROWTH FOR PROFESSIONAL & BUSINESS SERVICES

Although two of its three sectors reported small gains in September, **Professional & Business Services** dropped 400 jobs (-0.2 percent) over the month due to a 600-job loss in **Administrative & Support Services**. The industry's over-the-year gain of 4,400 jobs (+2.7 percent) was shared almost equally between the **Professional & Scientific Services** and **Administrative & Support Services** sectors. **Management of Companies** held relatively steady for the month and year.

SEASONAL FACTORS PUSH EDUCATION & HEALTH SERVICES TO MONTHLY JOB GAINS

Seasonal factors came into play in September for **Education & Health Services**, as the industry added jobs due to public school and university personnel returning to work following summer break. All of the seasonal monthly gain came from the **Educational Services** sector, which added 2,000 jobs (+12.7 percent) in September. Over the year, this industry has grown by 3,600 jobs (+2.0 percent) due to three of the four subsectors of **Health Care & Social Assistance**.

LEISURE & HOSPITALITY FALLS PREY TO SEASONAL FACTORS IN SEPTEMBER

Leisure & Hospitality took a big hit from seasonal factors in September, as the end of the summer vacation season forced the industry to shed 2,300 jobs (-1.7 percent) for the month. These monthly losses were shared between the Arts, Entertainment & Recreation and Accommodation & Food Services sectors. The two also combined to provide the industry's annual losses.

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GOVERNMENT SEES MONTHLY GAINS AS SCHOOL GEARS BACK UP

Government employment across the state reflected the return of public school and university personnel in September, as the industry added 15,800 jobs (+5.3 percent) over the month. Local Government provided over half of the monthly change by gaining 9,700 jobs (+5.6 percent), while **State Government** added 6,000 jobs (+7.7 percent). Local Government also contributed heavily to the September-to-September change by providing 6,800 of the 7,300 jobs added by the industry over the past year.

SEASONAL SERVICE PROVIDING GAINS MAKE SEPTEMBER A MONTH OF RECOVERY FOR OKLAHOMA CITY

Seasonal factors led Oklahoma City **TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** to add 6,700 jobs (+1.2 percent) over the month in September. These factors had a positive effect on industries related to education, such as **Education & Health Services** and **Government**, and a negative effect on leisure industries like **Leisure & Hospitality**. For the September-to-September period, Oklahoma City MSA gained 8,100 jobs (+1.5 percent) due to sizable growth in industries like **Construction**, **Trade, Transportation & Utilities**, and **Professional & Business Services**.

OKC CONSTRUCTION SHOWS STRONG GROWTH FOR YEAR

Oklahoma City **Construction** began its seasonal autumn slowdown in September by dropping 400 jobs (-1.6 percent) over the month. Despite this loss, the industry has gained 1,500 jobs (+6.3 percent) since September 2004. The **Specialty Trade Contractors** sector contributed a loss of 300 jobs for the month but a gain of 700 jobs for the year.

Manufacturing in Oklahoma City dropped 200 jobs (-0.5 percent) over the month in September, leaving the industry with 1,300 fewer jobs (-3.3 percent) than a year ago. Despite the overall loss, the **Durable Goods Manufacturing** sector gained 200 jobs over the month.

PROFESSIONAL & BUSINESS SERVICES ADDS JOBS FOR MONTH, YEAR

September's 300-job gain in **Professional & Business Services** was provided solely by the **Administrative & Support Services** sector. For the year, this industry has gained 1,800 jobs (+2.6 percent) spread among its three sectors. The **Professional & Scientific Services** sector contributed 900 jobs to the annual gain.
