## Oklahoma Employment Report - February 2006

#### **UNEMPLOYMENT RATES**

#### **AREAS OF INTEREST**

- 1. The Goods Producing Industries are growing faster than the state as a whole. All three major supersectors (Natural Resources & Mining, Construction, and Manufacturing) have been exhibiting unusual strength in their recoveries. As a group, the Goods Producing Industries reported annual growth of 4.5 percent for February, while the Service Providing Industries grew by 2.5 percent. For the year, TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT was up 2.9 percent in February.
- 2. While only representing a small percentage of Oklahoma's overall workforce, Natural Resources & Mining continues to play an "oversized" role in our economy due in large part to its above-average wages. While this supersector accounted for 8.5 percent of the state's total annual job growth in February, it only supplies around 2.5 percent of total state employment.
- 3. February's strong showing in statewide Manufacturing reinforces recent improvements in national industrial production numbers. All of the over-the-year gains in February came from the **Durable Goods** industry, as many consumers ignored higher interest rates and continued purchasing big ticket items.

### IN A NUTSHELL . . .

"Cyclical forces continued to boost Oklahoma's economy in February. The state's nonseasonally adjusted unemployment rate fell over the month, as employment grew by nearly the same number that unemployment dropped. At 3.6 percent, February's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate is at its lowest point since May 2001." Lynn Gray, OESC Chief Economist

All information contained within this document is available free of charge on the OESC website (www.oesc.state.ok.us/lmi/) and through LMI publications developed by the ER&A division. <u>Unless otherwise noted, all statistics are preliminary and have not been adjusted for seasonal factors.</u> All data is collected under strict guidelines provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Although a large amount of data has been presented, this in no way suggests that all data has been included. Due to space restrictions, only relevant industries and sectors are included for each geographic area.

#### STATE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE DOWN TO 4.1 PERCENT IN FEBRUARY

Oklahoma's **Unemployment Rate** dropped by three-tenths to 4.1 percent in February 2006. Looking at the non-seasonally adjusted data, **Unemployment** shed 5770 persons (-7.5 percent) over the month, while both **Employment** and **Labor Force** reported small gains.

Over the year, both **Employment** and **Labor Force** have grown by 24,280 persons (+0.1 percent) and 40,470 persons (+2.5 percent), respectively. Over the same period, statewide **Unemployment** dropped 16,190 persons (-18.5 percent).

#### ALL MSA UNEMPLOYMENT RATES DROP OVER MONTH IN FEBRUARY

The unemployment rates for all of the state's metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs) improved in February, dropping at least three-tenths of a percent over the month. **Oklahoma City MSA** went from 4.3 percent to 3.9 percent. **Tulsa MSA** decreased from 4.3 percent to 4.0 percent. The **Lawton MSA** had the largest drop, as it fell to 4.5 percent for the month.



#### OKLAHOMA'S OVER-THE-YEAR GROWTH CONTINUES IN FEBRUARY

In February, an over-the-month addition of 14,200 jobs (+0.9 percent) helped Oklahoma **TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** gain more than 40,000 jobs compared to February 2005. The 42,300-job annual increase translates into a growth rate of 2.9 percent. The **Service Providing Industries** accounted for nearly three-quarters of the over-the-year growth.

Under the **Goods Producing Industries**, **Natural Resources & Mining**, **Construction**, and **Manufacturing** each reported job gains for the month and year, with **Natural Resources & Mining** improving by more than 10 percent since February 2005. For the **Service Providing Industries**, annual growth was widespread. Over the month, many supersectors added jobs; **Government** saw the most dramatic over-themonth increase with a gain of 7,900 jobs (+2.5 percent).

#### CONSTRUCTION GROWS OVER MONTH & YEAR IN FEBRUARY

**Construction** rebounded from small monthly losses in January to add 600 jobs (+0.9 percent) over the month for February. The monthly gain was shared evenly by all **Construction** industries. Over the year, this supersector grew by nearly 6 percent, adding 3,500 jobs during the period. The **Specialty Trade Contractors** industry contributed 2,100 jobs to the annual growth.

#### OKLAHOMA CITY MSA ANNUAL GROWTH CONTINUES

**TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** for the Oklahoma City MSA rose in February with an addition of 5,400 jobs (+1.0 percent) over the month. Compared to February 2005, Oklahoma City **TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** has gained 16,300 jobs (+3.0 percent). The **Goods Producing Industries** and the **Service Providing Industries** both contributed to the monthly and annuals growth.

Under the Good Producing Industries, Natural Resources & Mining and Construction both reported strong over-the-year gains for February. For the Service Providing Industries, all supersectors added jobs over the year, except Other Services which reported a small annual decline.
