AREAS OF INTEREST

- 1. Despite recent losses in Manufacturing, the supersector has added 2,400 jobs (+1.6 percent) since October 2005. Much of this growth has come from the Durable Goods Manufacturing industries, most notably Fabricated Metal Products and Machinery Manufacturing.
- 2. Retail Trade posted a 1,500-job gain in October as stores began gearing up for holiday shopping. Over the year, Wholesale Trade provided nearly two-thirds of the jobs added in Trade, Transportation & Utilities, while Retail Trade managed only a marginal gain.
- **3. Seasonal education gains continued for Government in October.** Employment in statewide Government again reflected the start of the school year and the return of public school and university staff. The 4,900-job gain was right in line with the seasonal boost seen each year at this time.

IN A NUTSHELL . . .

"The service industries provided most of the job growth in October as seasonal factors continued to impact the state. Over the year, Oklahoma grew at a 1.5 percent clip, reflecting a strong job market. In addition, Oklahoma's unemployment rate dropped to 3.6 percent, the lowest it has been since April."

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STATE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE HITS SIX MONTH LOW IN OCTOBER

In October, Oklahoma's **non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate** dropped for the second straight month to settle at 3.6 percent, the lowest state unemployment rate reported since April of this year. Over the month, **non-seasonally adjusted labor force** (+11,600 persons) and **employment** (+14,574 persons) both reported growth, as **non-seasonally adjusted unemployment** (-2,974 persons) shed almost 5.0 percent.

Oklahoma's **seasonally adjusted unemployment rate** also reported a 0.2 percent loss in October, as **seasonally adjusted labor force** (+1,780 persons), **employment** (+5,036 persons) and **unemployment** (-3,256 persons) followed patterns similar to the non-seasonally adjusted data.

ALL MSA UNEMPLOYMENT RATES DROP IN OCTOBER

Unemployment rates for all Oklahoma metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs) dropped by 0.2 percent over the month in October. The **Oklahoma City** and **Tulsa MSAs** shared an unemployment rate of 3.5 percent, while the unemployment rate for the **Lawton MSA** fell to 4.2 percent.



ROGER MILLS & WOODWARD COUNTIES SHARE STATE'S LOWEST COUNTY UNEMPLOYMENT RATE IN OCTOBER

October's lowest county unemployment rate of 2.5 percent was reported by both **Roger Mills** and **Woodward** counties. There was a four-way tie for the second lowest county rate at 2.6 percent among **Beckham**, **Ellis**, **Kingfisher** and **Murray** counties. At 2.7 percent, **Dewey County** rounded out the state's three lowest county unemployment rates for October.

SERVICE INDUSTRIES DRIVE MONTHLY & ANNUAL JOB GAINS IN OCTOBER

Oklahoma's **TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** added jobs for the month and year in October. Although both the **Goods Producing Industries** and **Service Providing Industries** contributed to the expansion, service-related jobs made up almost all of the monthly gain and more than two-thirds of the annual gain. Under the **Service Providing Industries**, seasonal factors again led to over-the-month growth in **Education & Health Services** and **Government. Leisure & Hospitality** also reported seasonal change, dropping 800 jobs (-0.6 percent) over the month. The service industries contributing the most growth were **Trade**, **Transportation & Utilities**, **Professional & Business Services**, **Education & Health Services**, and **Government**.

NATURAL RESOURCES & MINING CONTINUES TO EXPAND OVER YEAR

Statewide **Natural Resources & Mining** continued to post strong over-the-year growth in October, as it added 3,500 jobs (+9.4 percent) compared to October 2005. **Support Activities for Mining** provided most of the monthly growth and all of the annual growth.

SEASONAL FACTORS AFFECT STATE CONSTRUCTION IN OCTOBER

Statewide **Construction** continued to report seasonal losses in October, dropping by 600 jobs (-0.9 percent) over the month. **Specialty Trade Contractors** shed 1,100 jobs (-2.6 percent) in October, but this loss was partially counteracted by gains in **Construction of Buildings** and **Heavy & Civil Engineering**. All three sectors reported over-the-year growth totaling 1,200 jobs (+1.8 percent).

GROWTH CONTINUES FOR TRADE, TRANSPORTATION & UTILITIES

Retail Trade drove over-the-month growth for **Trade**, **Transportation & Utilities** in October by providing 1,500 of the 1,800 jobs gained for the month. For the year, the other two sectors, **Wholesale Trade** and **Transportation**, **Warehouse & Utilities**, contributed almost all of the 3,400-job addition (+1.2 percent).

SEASONAL FACTORS HELP OKLAHOMA CITY POST GAINS FOR MONTH

In September, **TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** for the Oklahoma City metropolitan statistical area (MSA) continued to expand, gaining 10,300 jobs (+1.8 percent) for the month and 9,000 jobs (+1.6 percent) for the year. The **Service Providing Industries** contributed most of the monthly and annual gains, as seasonal education factors drove growth in **Government**. **Leisure & Hospitality** also experienced seasonal change in September, dropping 1,000 jobs over the month as the summer vacation season drew to a close.

SEASONAL FACTORS LEAD TO SMALL LOSS IN OKC CONSTRUCTION

Although it managed to avoid the seasonal losses seen across the state in September, Oklahoma City **Construction** fell in line in October, shedding 100 jobs (-0.4 percent) for the month due to **Specialty Trade Contractors**. The seasonal loss didn't slow the supersector's annual growth; it reported an 1,800-job gain (+7.1 percent) compared to October 2005.

TULSA CONTINUES TO ADD JOBS OVER MONTH & YEAR IN OCTOBER

Tulsa MSA **TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** continued to expand in October, as it gained 2,100 jobs (+0.5 percent) over the month and 7,700 jobs (+1.8 percent) over the year. The **Service Providing Industries** contributed all of the monthly gain and more than three-quarters of the annual change. Over the month, **Government** provided most of the net change due to seasonal education factors. The **Goods Producing Industries** grew by 1,800 jobs (+2.4 percent) over the year.
