## AREAS OF INTEREST

- 1. Natural Resources and Mining continues to expand at a rapid pace. The industry has grown by more than 10,000 jobs in the past four years.
- 2. Construction also continues to grow faster than the state as a whole, led by the Residential Construction segment. However, Residential Construction's growth rate is down compared to the overall growth rate of 2005 and is well off the pace seen in March 2005.
- 3. Over the year, a majority of the Durable Goods Manufacturing sector expanded faster than the state as a whole and much faster than Non-durable Goods Manufacturing. The major exception to the growth was Transportation Equipment Manufacturing, where employment was pulled down by declines in the Motor Vehicle Manufacturing sector.
- 4. Leisure & Hospitality is well off the pace it set in 2005. The slowdown is heavily concentrated in Accommodation & Food Services. Full Service Restaurants, which grew by 3.5 percent in 2005, has been slowly shedding jobs for the past 12 months.

## IN A NUTSHELL . . .

"Overall, Oklahoma's 2006 employment growth has outpaced the January-to-March growth seen last year. In fact, since the oil boom of the early 1980s, the only year to post a higher rate of job growth than we are now seeing was 1998." Lynn Gray, OESC Chief Economist

All data is collected under strict guidelines provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Although a large amount of data has been presented, this in no way suggests that all data has been included. Due to space restrictions, only relevant industries and sectors are included for each geographic area.

## STATE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE NUDGES HIGHER IN MARCH

Oklahoma's non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate rose by one-tenth to 4.2 percent in March, as the state's non-seasonally adjusted labor force, employment and unemployment all expanded over the month. Although non-seasonally adjusted employment grew by three-tenths of a percent in March, this growth rate was slower than is typically seen for the February-to-March period.

Compared to March 2005, Oklahoma's non-seasonally adjusted unemployment dropped by more than 9,000 persons (-11.1 percent). Non-seasonally adjusted labor force and non-seasonally adjusted employment added 26,005 persons (+1.5 percent) and 35,105 persons (+3.1 percent) for the year, respectively.

## MARCH UNEMPLOYMENT RATES UP IN OKLAHOMA CITY & LAWTON

The unemployment rates for two of the state's metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs) improved in March, while one MSA reported no change. The unemployment rate for the **Oklahoma City MSA** rose by two-tenths to 4.1 percent over the month, and **Lawton MSA** grew by one-tenth to 4.6 percent. **Tulsa MSA** held steady at 4.0 percent for the month.

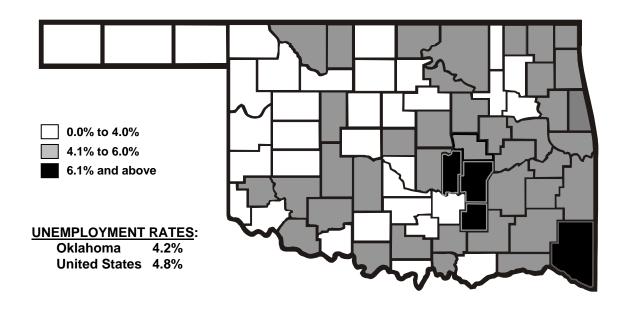

## **WOODWARD COUNTY CLAIMS STATE'S LOWEST RATE FOR MARCH**

#### OKLAHOMA SEES MONTHLY & ANNUAL GROWTH IN MARCH

Oklahoma continued to see strong over-the-year growth in March 2006, as **TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** added more than 40,000 jobs for the March-to-March period. The 41,400-job addition translates into a growth rate of 2.9 percent. Both the **Goods Producing Industries** and the **Service Providing Industries** contributed to the monthly and annual gains.

For the Goods Producing Industries, Natural Resources & Mining, Construction, and Manufacturing each reported job gains for the month and year, with Natural Resources & Mining improving by more than 10 percent since March 2005. Under the Service Providing Industries, growth was also widespread. Leisure & Hospitality gained 2,900 jobs (+2.2 percent) over the month, while Trade, Transportation & Utilities and Government both reported annual gains of at least 7,000 jobs.

## RETAIL TRADE CONTINUES TO DRIVE CHANGE IN MARCH

## OKLAHOMA CITY MSA CONTINUES GROWTH TREND IN MARCH

**TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** for the Oklahoma City MSA once again surged forward, adding 5,700 jobs (+1.0 percent) over the month and 16,700 jobs (+3.0 percent) for the year. The **Goods Producing Industries** and the **Service Providing Industries** both contributed to the monthly and annual growth.

The news was good for the **Good Producing Industries**, except in **Manufacturing**. **Manufacturing** dropped 300 jobs (-0.8 percent) for the month and is down by 1,200 jobs (-3.1 percent) over the year. For the **Service Providing Industries**, most supersectors added jobs over the month and year, with **Trade**, **Transportation & Utilities**, **Professional & Business Services**, and **Leisure & Hospitality** reporting strong monthly movement.

## **OKC EDUCATION & HEALTH SERVICES SEES MONTHLY, ANNUAL GAINS**
