AREAS OF INTEREST

- **1.** Oklahoma's annual employment growth rate declined for the third straight month. At 1.9 percent, the annual employment growth rate is still higher than the average rate for the past 25 years (1.3 percent). The Goods Producing Industries continued to outpace the Service Providing Industries, growing by 4.4 percent over the year compared to 1.4 percent.
- 2. Durable Goods Manufacturing continues to post positive, but uneven, movement. Increased activity in the Mining sector fueled employment gains in Fabricated Metal Manufacturing, while Motor Vehicle Manufacturing and Motor Vehicle Body & Part Manufacturing reported significant declines.
- 3. Several service industries are seeing declines in employment. Prominent among these are Food & Beverage Stores, General Merchandise Stores, Full-service Restaurants, and Limited-service Eating.

IN A NUTSHELL . . .

"While most of the monthly increase in the state unemployment rate can be explained by seasonal factors, there is evidence that employment growth is slowing. At this point, this slowdown should be neither alarming nor surprising given the Fed's continued moves to slow inflation by increasing interest rates."

All data is collected under strict guidelines provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Although a large amount of data has been presented, this in no way suggests that all data has been included. Due to space restrictions, only relevant industries and sectors are included for each geographic area.

SEASONAL FACTORS AGAIN AT HEART OF MONTHLY EMPLOYMENT MOVEMENT IN MAY

Following the typical April-to-May trend, Oklahoma's **non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate** gained back much of what it lost in April to settle at 4.1 percent (+0.5 percent). This rate increase was caused by seasonal changes in Oklahoma's statewide **non-seasonally adjusted employment** (-2,326 persons), **non-seasonally adjusted unemployment** (+8,866 persons) and **non-seasonally adjusted labor force** (+6,540 persons). May's unemployment rate growth can be mainly attributed to the 14.1 percent growth seen in **non-seasonally adjusted unemployment**. This gain represents nearly 85 percent of the jobs lost during the March-to-April period.

ALL MSA UNEMPLOYMENT RATES UP IN MAY 2006

All Oklahoma metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs) reported unemployment rate increases of at least 0.4 percent in May, reversing course from April's unemployment rate drop. Over the month, the unemployment rates for the **Oklahoma City** and **Tulsa MSAs** rose to 3.9 percent and 4.0 percent, respectively. **Lawton MSA** saw the biggest jump, as its unemployment rate rose from 3.9 percent to 4.5 percent.

COAL & McCURTAIN COUNTIES AGAIN REPORT HIGHEST COUNTY UNEMPLOYMENT RATES IN OKLAHOMA

In May 2006, **Coal County** and **McCurtain County** again posted the highest and second highest county unemployment rates in the state. At 7.1 percent, **Coal County**'s rate was up by 0.5 percent, while **McCurtain County** reached 6.5 percent after a gain of 0.8 percent. **Seminole County** rounded out Oklahoma's top three highest county rates in May at 6.1 percent.



ROGER MILLS COUNTY CLAIMS STATE'S LOWEST UNEMPLOYMENT RATE IN MAY

After sharing April's lowest county unemployment rate with **Woodward County**, **Roger Mills County** claimed sole possession of May's lowest rate at 2.7 percent. **Woodward County** slipped to second place with an unemployment rate of 2.8 percent. **Beaver, Cotton** and **Ellis counties** shared the state's third lowest county unemployment rate of 2.9 percent for May.

STATE OF OKLAHOMA

SEASONAL CHANGE, ANNUAL GROWTH CONTINUE IN MAY 2006

Oklahoma continued to add jobs in May 2006, as the state's **TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** gained 3,600 jobs (+0.2 percent) for the month and 28,300 jobs (+1.9 percent) over the year. The **Goods Producing Industries** and the **Service Providing Industries** both contributed to the monthly and annual gains.

The Goods Producing Industries continued to strengthen in May, as Natural Resources & Mining, Construction, and Manufacturing all reported job gains for the month and year. For the Service Providing Industries, seasonal losses were reported in Educational & Health Services (-400 jobs over month), while seasonal gains were seen in Leisure & Hospitality (+1,300 jobs over month). For the May-to-May period, the Goods Producing Industries and the Service Providing Industries continued expanding, with the Goods Producing Industries growing at a rate of 4.4 percent.

SEASONAL GROWTH PICKS UP IN STATEWIDE CONSTRUCTION

In May, seasonal factors once again helped statewide **Construction** gain jobs for the month. May's overthe-month growth of 1,200 jobs (+1.8 percent) was three times more than April's seasonal monthly gains. For the year, **Construction** grew by 4,300 jobs (+6.6 percent). The **Specialty Trade Contractors** industry continued to provide a majority of the monthly and annual growth.

PROFESSIONAL & BUSINESS SERVICES CONTINUES TO GROW IN MAY

MONTHLY & ANNUAL GROW/TH CONTINUE FOR OKLAHOMA CITY

In May, **TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** rose to 571,100 jobs with gains of 2,500 jobs (+0.4 percent) for the month and 13,700 jobs (+2.5 percent) over the year. The **Goods Producing Industries** and the **Service Providing Industries** each contributed to the monthly and annual growth.

Under the **Good Producing Industries**, **Natural Resources & Mining** held steady for the month, as **Construction** and **Manufacturing** added jobs. For the **Service Providing Industries**, **Professional & Business Services** and **Leisure & Hospitality** led the way over the month. Almost all of the **Service Providing Industries** reported sizeable annual growth in May 2006.
