## **Oklahoma Employment Report - August 2006**

#### **AREAS OF INTEREST**

- 1. Significant employment declines are now clearly visible in the statewide Motor Vehicle Manufacturing industry. These losses are concentrated in the Oklahoma City MSA and have fueled the overall employment decline in Oklahoma City MSA manufacturing.
- 2. Statewide Retail Trade struggled in August. For the August-to-August period, Retail Trade reported no employment growth, and when looking at percentage growth, the sector experienced its weakest July-to-August period since 1991.
- 3. In terms of employment growth, the Tulsa MSA continues to outpace both the Oklahoma City MSA and the state as a whole. Tulsa is showing particular strength throughout the Professional & Business Services supersector.

#### IN A NUTSHELL . . .

"Statewide employment continues to grow, but the pace is slowing. In August, percentage employment growth fell again in both the Goods Producing Industries and the Service Providing Industries. The seasonally adjusted data show that although the number of unemployed in the state grew to its highest level in 2006, it is still below the unemployed level seen last year at this time."

All data is collected under strict guidelines provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Although a large amount of data has been presented, this in no way suggests that all data has been included. Due to space restrictions, only relevant industries and sectors are included for each geographic area.

#### STATE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE RISES TO 4.0 PERCENT IN AUGUST

Oklahoma's statewide **non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate** grew by 0.2 percent in August to 4.0 percent. Over the month, **non-seasonally adjusted labor force** (-16,964 persons) and **employment** (-19,380 persons) both contracted, while **non-seasonally adjusted unemployment** (+2,416 persons) expanded.

Oklahoma's **seasonally adjusted unemployment rate** also increased by two-tenths of a percent, settling at 4.2 percent in August. **Seasonally adjusted labor force** (+1,895 persons) and **unemployment** (+3,136 persons) increased over the month, as **seasonally adjusted employment** (-1,241 persons) shrunk by one-tenth of a percent.

#### AUGUST BRINGS HIKES FOR ALL MSA UNEMPLOYMENT RATES

Unemployment rates for all Oklahoma metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs) increased in August 2006. The Oklahoma City MSA unemployment rate was 3.8 percent, a gain of 0.1 percent for the month. Tulsa MSA's 3.8 percent was two-tenths of a percent higher than in July. Lawton MSA also saw a two-tenths gain, as its unemployment rate rose to 4.5 percent in August.

#### McCURTAIN COUNTY REPORTS HIGHEST COUNTY RATE FOR AUGUST

**McCurtain County** posted the highest county unemployment rate in August at 6.4 percent, the same rate it held in July. **Hughes County** reported the state's second highest rate of 6.2 percent. **Coal County** rounded out August's top three highest county rates at 6.1 percent.



#### ROGER MILLS COUNTY REPORTS STATE'S LOWEST COUNTY UNEMPLOYMENT RATE AGAIN

At 2.5 percent, **Roger Mills County's** unemployment rate was once again the state's lowest county rate. **Ellis**, **Kingfisher** and **Woodward counties** shared the state's second lowest county unemployment rate of 2.7 percent. There was also a tie at 2.8 percent for Oklahoma's third highest county unemployment rate among **Beckham**, **Harper**, **Major** and **Murray counties**.

#### STATE SEES SMALL MONTHLY, LARGER ANNUAL GAINS IN AUGUST

Reversing the trend of the past few months, Oklahoma's **TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** posted a small monthly gain in August 2006, as growth in the **Service Providing Industries** overcame minor losses in the **Goods Producing Industries**. These two divisions combined for an over-the-year gain of 15,900 jobs (+1.1 percent). This over-the-year growth was seen in most industries. One exception was **Other Services**, an industry that shed 600 jobs (-0.8 percent) for the month and 800 jobs (-1.1 percent) for the year.

#### **OKLAHOMA CITY MSA ADDS JOBS FOR MONTH & YEAR IN AUGUST**

In August, **TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** for the Oklahoma City metropolitan statistical area (MSA) reversed course, gaining 1,700 jobs (+0.3 percent) for the month after posting losses the past two months. The **Service Providing Industries** contributed all of the monthly and annual gains, as the **Goods Producing Industries** reported no change for the August-to-August period. For the year, the **Oklahoma City MSA** has grown by 7,400 jobs (+1.3 percent).
