#### **AREAS OF INTEREST**

- 1. Natural Resources & Mining employment continues to expand at a pace well above that of the state as a whole. In September 2006, industry employment was the highest it has been since 1990.
- 2. Growth in Construction has slowed in recent months. During the first two quarters of 2006, Construction posted annual growth rates above 6.0 percent. For the third quarter that ended in September, the industry's annual growth rate fell to 3.4 percent. For the September-to-September period, the growth rate was down to 2.7 percent. It should be noted, however, that growth is slowing in both the residential and non-residential parts of this industry.
- 3. The Employment Services sector of Professional & Business Services dropped jobs during the August-to-September period for the first time since 2001. Employment in the area is down about 3.5 percent from a year ago.

#### IN A NUTSHELL . . .

"Overall job growth stabilized in September and showed signs of rebounding from the slowing pace of job creation seen over the past few months. In addition, Oklahoma's unemployment rate dropped over the month but stayed within the same narrow range it has occupied for all of 2006."

**NOTE:** This publication is produced by the Economic Research & Analysis division of the Oklahoma Employment Security Commission as a no cost service. All information contained within this document is available free of charge on the OESC website (www.oesc.state.ok.us/lmi/) and through LMI publications developed by the ER&A division. <u>Unless otherwise noted</u>, <u>all statistics</u> <u>are preliminary and have not been adjusted for seasonal factors</u>. All data is collected under strict guidelines provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Although a large amount of data has been presented, this in no way suggests that all data has been included. Due to space restrictions, only relevant industries and sectors are included for each geographic area.

#### STATE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE DROPS TO 3.8 PERCENT IN SEPTEMBER

Oklahoma's statewide **non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate** dropped by 0.2 percent in September to settle at 3.8 percent, the same rate it reported in July 2006. Over the month, **non-seasonally adjusted labor force** (+2,634 persons) and **employment** (+6,027 persons) both reported marginal growth, while **non-seasonally adjusted unemployment** (-3,393 persons) shrunk by nearly 5.0 percent.

Oklahoma's **seasonally adjusted unemployment rate** also reported a 0.2 percent drop in September, as **seasonally adjusted labor force** (+8,197 persons), **employment** (+11,017 persons) and **unemployment** (-2,890 persons) followed patterns similar to the non-seasonally adjusted data.

#### ALL MSA UNEMPLOYMENT RATES DOWN IN SEPTEMBER

Unemployment rates for all Oklahoma metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs) dropped by 0.1 percent in September. The **Oklahoma City** and **Tulsa MSAs** shared an unemployment rate of 3.7 percent, while the unemployment rate for the **Lawton MSA** fell to 4.4 percent over the month.



# ELLIS COUNTY & MURRAY COUNTY SHARE STATE'S LOWEST COUNTY UNEMPLOYMENT RATE IN SEPTEMBER

In September, the lowest county unemployment rate of 2.6 percent was reported by both **Ellis** and **Murray** counties. There was a four-way tie at 2.7 percent for the second lowest county rate among **Dewey**, **Kingfisher**, **Roger Mills** and **Woodward** counties. **Beckham** and **Major** counties shared the state's third lowest rate of 2.8 percent.

#### SEASONAL FACTORS CONTRIBUTE TO SEPTEMBER'S GAINS

Oklahoma's **TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** continued to improve in September, as it posted gains of 17,200 jobs (+1.1 percent) for the month and 19,700 jobs (+1.3 percent) for the year. The **Service Providing Industries** accounted for all of the monthly growth, as the start of classes at public schools and universities led to seasonal gains in **Education & Health Services** and **Government**. For the year, the **Service Providing Industries** contributed nearly two-thirds of the growth, again thanks to the **Government** supersector. All three of the supersectors classified as **Good Producing Industries** (**Natural Resources & Mining, Construction**, and **Manufacturing**) reported strong growth for the year.

#### SEASONAL FACTORS FORCE SLOWDOWN IN STATE CONSTRUCTION

A seasonal slowdown began to affect statewide **Construction** in September, leading to a monthly loss of 1,000 jobs (-1.4 percent). The **Specialty Trade Contractors** sector provided almost all of the monthly loss and much of the annual gain of 1,800 jobs (+2.7 percent).

#### MANUFACTURING CONTINUES ANNUAL GROWTH IN SEPTEMBER

In September, **Durable Goods Manufacturing** again drove over-the-year growth in September, as **Manufacturing** reported an annual gain of 1,900 jobs (+1.3 percent). Much of the growth was provided by **Fabricated Metal Products** and **Machinery Manufacturing**. For the month, **Manufacturing** added 700 jobs (+0.5 percent).

#### STATE PROFESSIONAL & BUSINESS SERVICES ADDS JOBS FOR YEAR

**Professional & Business Services** grew by 800 jobs (+0.5 percent) over the year in September, as a 1,400-job gain in the **Professional & Scientific Services** sector overcame losses in the **Management of Companies** and **Administrative & Support Services** sectors. Despite the annual growth, the supersector dropped by 400 jobs (-0.2 percent) for the month.

#### EDUCATION & HEALTH SERVICES UP FOR BOTH MONTH & YEAR

In September, seasonal education factors led to a sizeable monthly gain in **Education & Health Services**, driven by an **Educational Services** sector that added 3,200 jobs (+20.5 percent) over the month. For the year, it was the **Health Care & Social Assistance** sector that provided most of the growth with a gain of 1,600 jobs (+1.0 percent).

#### LEISURE & HOSPITALITY REPORTS SEASONAL LOSS IN SEPTEMBER

Leisure & Hospitality was also affected by a seasonal slowdown in September, shedding 1,100 jobs (-0.8 percent) for the month. The monthly losses were divided between Art, Entertainment & Recreation and Accommodation & Food Services. The annual change reported by these two sectors negated each other, leaving Leisure & Hospitality at the same level it held in September 2005. Under Accommodation & Food Services, Food Services & Drinking Places accounted for most of the sector's monthly and annual losses.

#### SEASONAL GOVERNMENT GAINS CONTINUE IN SEPTEMBER

Following the trend started last month, **Government** added 17,100 jobs (+5.6 percent) in September, as public schools and universities opened for the new school year. Over half of the monthly gain came from **Local Government**, with **State Government** contributing more than one-third of the jobs gained. A similar pattern can be seen in the year-to-year data, although this pattern is not related to seasonal factors.

#### SEASONAL FACTORS HELP OKLAHOMA CITY POST GAINS FOR MONTH

In September, **TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** for the Oklahoma City metropolitan statistical area (MSA) continued to expand, gaining 10,300 jobs (+1.8 percent) for the month and 9,000 jobs (+1.6 percent) for the year. The **Service Providing Industries** contributed most of the monthly and annual gains, as seasonal education factors drove growth in **Government**. **Leisure & Hospitality** also experienced seasonal change in September, dropping 1,000 jobs over the month as the summer vacation season drew to a close.

#### **OKC EDUCATION & HEALTH SERVICES GROWS OVER MONTH & YEAR**

Despite a 1,000-job loss in **Health Care & Social Assistance**, seasonal education factors pushed Oklahoma City **Education & Health Services** to gain 600 jobs (+0.9 percent) for the month in September. This gain is the result of major seasonal growth in **Educational Services** combined with a 1,000-job loss **Health Care & Social Assistance**. These two sectors provided a 400-job gain for the year.
