AREAS OF INTEREST

- **1. Oklahoma's unemployment rate dropped to 3.6 percent in April.** Although a significant change, this drop is in line with seasonal changes seen each year for the March-to-April period.
- **2.** In April, the ongoing annual employment growth slowed in almost every major industry. However, employment growth continues to be led by increases in the Goods Producing Industries, in particular by Natural Resources & Mining.
- **3.** Leisure & Hospitality continues to lag behind the pace it set in 2005. The slowdown is heavily concentrated in Accommodation & Food Services. Full Service Restaurants, which grew by 3.5 percent in 2005, reported absolutely no change when compared with April 2005.

IN A NUTSHELL . . .

"Overall, Oklahoma's 2006 employment growth has been strong. Although April brought a slowdown in most of the annual growth, almost all industries added jobs compared to April 2005. It appears that we will see this positive trend continue in the months to come." *Lynn Gray, OESC Chief Economist*

All data is collected under strict guidelines provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Although a large amount of data has been presented, this in no way suggests that all data has been included. Due to space restrictions, only relevant industries and sectors are included for each geographic area.

SEASONAL FACTORS PUSH UNEMPLOYMENT RATE DOWN TO 3.6 PERCENT IN APRIL

Seasonal factors heavily influenced Oklahoma's **non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate** over the month, forcing a drop from 4.2 percent in March to 3.6 percent in April. Although this drop is significant, it follows the pattern seen each year for the March-to-April period.

This drop is also reflected in the state's employment levels. Over the month, Oklahoma's **non-seasonally adjusted unemployment** shed more than 14 percent, or 10,473 persons. As this happened, **non-seasonally adjusted employment** added more than 13,000 persons (+0.8 percent), and the state's **non-seasonally adjusted labor force** grew by 2,715 persons (+0.2 percent). Compared to March 2005, Oklahoma's **non-seasonally adjusted labor force** has gained nearly 20,000 persons (+1.2 percent).

ALL MSA UNEMPLOYMENT RATES DROP IN APRIL 2006

All Oklahoma metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs) reported improvement in April, as MSA unemployment rates all dropped by at least 0.5 percent. The unemployment rate for the **Oklahoma City MSA** fell by six-tenths to 3.5 percent over the month, and the **Tulsa MSA** rate dropped by one-half a percent, also to 3.5 percent. **Lawton MSA** saw the most improvement, as its unemployment rate went from 4.6 percent in March to 3.9 percent in April.

COUNTIES WITH HIGHEST UNEMPLOYMENT RATES HOLD POSITIONS OVER MONTH

The three counties with the highest unemployment rates in April were unchanged from March 2006. At 6.6 percent, **Coal County's** unemployment rate was again the state's highest rate despite dropping by two-tenths over the month. **McCurtain County** reported a rate of 5.8 percent for the month, and **Hughes County** rounded out the three highest county rates at 5.5 percent in April.



ROGER MILLS, WOODWARD COUNTIES SHARE STATE'S LOWEST RATE

In April, **Woodward County** again claimed the state's lowest county unemployment rate at 2.3 percent, sharing the position with **Roger Mills County**. **Ellis County** held sole possession of second place at 2.4 percent. **Beaver**, **Beckham** and **Harper** counties tied for the third lowest rate in April at 2.5 percent.

MONTHLY & ANNUAL GROW/TH CONTINUES ACROSS STATE IN APRIL

Job growth continued across Oklahoma in April 2006. The state's **TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** added 7,100 jobs (+0.5 percent) for the month and 33,600 jobs (+2.2 percent) over the year. The monthly and annual gains were provided by both the **Goods Producing Industries** and the **Service Providing Industries**.

Under the **Goods Producing Industries**, **Natural Resources & Mining**, **Construction**, and **Manufacturing** each reported substantial job gains for the month and year, with **Natural Resources & Mining** improving by more than 10 percent since April 2005. For the **Service Providing Industries**, both monthly growth and annual growth were widespread. **Professional & Business Services** added 2,000 jobs (+1.2 percent) for the month, and **Leisure & Hospitality** saw a seasonal gain of 3,400 jobs (+2.6 percent) in April. For the April-to-April period, gains were also reported for **Trade**, **Transportation & Utilities** (+4,800 jobs), **Financial Activities** (+1,600 jobs), **Professional & Business Services** (+5,100 jobs), **Educational & Health Services** (+4,900 jobs), **Leisure & Hospitality** (+1,400 jobs), and **Government** (+6,200 jobs).

SUPPORT ACTIVITIES FOR MINING FUELS ANNUAL GROWTH AGAIN

Natural Resources & Mining continued its over-the-year growth in April by adding 3,600 jobs (+10.3 percent) compared to April 2005. **Support Activities for Mining** provided a majority of the annual gain.

SEASONAL GROWTH CONTINUES IN STATEWIDE CONSTRUCTION

Seasonal factors once again affected statewide **Construction** in April, as the supersector grew by 400 jobs (+0.6 percent) over the month. For the year, **Construction** grew by 3,000 jobs (+4.6 percent), 1,600 of which came from the **Specialty Trade Contractors** industry.

RETAIL TRADE REVERSES COURSE IN APRIL BY DROPPING 500 JOBS

Since April 2005, Trade, Transportation & Utilities has grown by 4,800 jobs (+1.7 percent) due to gains in all component industries.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT DRIVES GROWTH FOR MONTH & YEAR AGAIN

Government growth in April was due mostly to **Local Government**, which gained 400 jobs (+0.1 percent) for the month and 6,200 jobs (+2.0 percent) over the year. **Federal Government** added 100 jobs (+0.2 percent) over the month in April, and **State Government** contributed 1,400 jobs to the over-the-year addition.

OKLAHOMA CITY CONTINUES MONTHLY & ANNUAL GROWTH IN APRIL

In April, **TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** rose once again in the Oklahoma City MSA, adding 3,000 jobs (+0.5 percent) over the month and 12,600 jobs (+2.3 percent) for the year. The **Goods Producing Industries** and the **Service Providing Industries** both contributed to the monthly and annual growth. Under the **Good Producing Industries**, **Construction** continued to experience seasonal growth. For the April-to-April period, the **Good Producing Industries** all added jobs except **Manufacturing**, which dropped 1,100 jobs (-2.8 percent) over the year. For the **Service Providing Industries**, most supersectors added jobs over the month, with **Trade**, **Transportation & Utilities** leading the way. Large annual gains were reported in **Trade**, **Transportation & Utilities**, **Professional & Business Services**, and **Educational & Health Services**.
