AREAS OF INTEREST

- 1. Construction posted its largest December-to-December gain since 1999. The industry's 3,500-job over-the-year gain translates into an annual growth rate of 5.3 percent. This is more good news following last month when Construction posted its first October-to-November employment gain since 1994.
- 2. Financial Activities reported its first November-to-December job loss since 1990. Although the loss was only 700 jobs (-0.8 percent), it goes against the trend seen during the last few decades. The industry came closest to losses in 2001 and 2002 when no change was reported for the November-to-December period.

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STATE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE HOLDS STEADY IN DECEMBER

For December, Oklahoma's **non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate** was unchanged from November's rate of 3.7 percent. The state **non-seasonally adjusted rate** has been at or below 4.0 percent since July 2006. Small over-the-month losses were reported in the state's **non-seasonally adjusted labor force** (-3,209 persons), **employment** (-2,955 persons) and **unemployment** (-254 persons).

For the December-to-December period, the state job market continued to improve as **non-seasonally adjusted labor force** (+10,623 persons), **employment** (+14,262 persons) and **unemployment** (-3,639 persons) all strengthened over the year. The state's **non-seasonally adjusted unemployment** rate dropped by 0.3 percent compared to December 2005.



OKLAHOMA'S ANNUAL JOB GROWTH CONTINUES IN DECEMBER

Oklahoma's **TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** continued its over-the-year growth in December, adding 20,300 jobs (+1.3 percent) for the December-to-December period. The growth came from both the **Goods Producing Industries** and the **Service Providing Industries**. The **Goods Producing Industries** provided all 200 jobs gained over the month in December. Over-the-month losses were widespread among the **Service Providing Industries**.

STATE CONSTRUCTION GAINS JOBS FOR MONTH & YEAR

TRADE, TRANSPORTATION & UTILITIES CONTINUES TO GROW

Retail Trade drove over-the-month expansion for **Trade, Transportation & Utilities** in December by adding 2,100 jobs (+1.2 percent) due to seasonal hiring for the holiday shopping season. Over the year, the industry's other two sectors, **Wholesale Trade** and **Transportation, Warehouse & Utilities**, outperformed **Retail Trade** by contributing 1,100 jobs and 1,000 jobs, respectively.

The monthly loss was driven by large losses in Administrative & Support Services and a smaller loss in Management of Companies. Professional & Scientific Services and Administrative & Support Services provided the net annual growth in December.

In December, **TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** for the Oklahoma City metropolitan statistical area (MSA) continued to expand by adding 800 jobs (+0.1 percent) for the month and 8,900 jobs (+1.6 percent) for the year. Both the **Goods Producing Industries** and the **Service Providing Industries** contributed to the monthly growth, while nearly 75 percent of the annual change came from the **Service Providing Industries**. SEASONAL FACTORS CONTINUE TO DRIVE GROWTH IN TRADE, TRANSPORTATION & UTILITIES

December employment in Oklahoma City **Trade**, **Transportation & Utilities** was assisted by holiday hiring, as **Retail Trade** led the industry to a net monthly gain of 1,000 jobs (+1.0 percent). Over the year, **Retail Trade** was down by 1,000 jobs (-1.5 percent), which tempered annual gains in **Wholesale Trade** and **Transportation**, **Warehouse & Utilities**. The net result was an annual gain of 400 jobs (+0.4 percent) for the industry.

TULSA ADDS JOBS OVER THE MONTH & YEAR IN DECEMBER

Tulsa MSA TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT continued to expand in December, as it gained 1,000 jobs (+0.2 percent) over the month and 10,500 jobs (+2.5 percent) over the year. The Service Providing Industries contributed most of the monthly gain and more than 75 percent of the annual gain. Trade, Transportation & Utilities reported the largest monthly gain of any industry with an addition of 1,000 jobs (+1.2 percent) in December. Sizeable annual gains were seen in Construction; Manufacturing; Trade, Transportation & Utilities; Professional & Business Services; Education & Health Services; and Government.
