OKLAHOMA EMPLOYMENT REPORT - January 2007

State unemployment rate jumps to 4.4 percent

Oklahoma's non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate experienced a big shift in January, as it gained seven-tenths to settle at 4.4 percent for the month. Large seasonal losses helped push non-seasonally adjusted labor force and employment to contract and non-seasonally adjusted unemployment to expand, leading to the unemployment rate bump.

Seasonal losses dominate state employment for month

- Natural Resources & Mining was the only statewide industry to gain jobs in January 2007. Over the last 12 months, the only time this industry failed to add jobs was the November-to-December period.
- Seasonal losses affected Construction in January. The Specialty Trade Contractors sector accounted for twothirds of the 1,800 jobs lost by the industry.
- Due to seasonal losses in Retail Trade following the holiday shopping season, Trade, Transportation & Utilities accounted for nearly one-third of the losses in January. Retail Trade shed 8,400 jobs in January, more than 25 percent of all jobs lost.

LOCAL AREA UNEMPLOYMENT STATISTICS

The statistics in this section are gathered from the **Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS)** program. LAUS produces estimates of the labor force, employment, unemployment and unemployment rate for the state and its subdivisions based on where workers live. Data is derived from a monthly household survey, and all LAUS numbers refer to individual persons rather than their jobs.

Despite over-the-year improvement, state unemployment rate up in January

In January 2007, Oklahoma's statewide **unemployment rate** rose by seven-tenths of a percent to 4.4 percent. This is the first time the state unemployment rate has topped 4.0 percent since June 2006.

For the month, Oklahoma's **non-seasonally adjusted labor force** and **non-seasonally adjusted employment** dropped by 18,184 (-1.1 percent) and 28,138 persons (-1.7 percent), respectively. In contrast, **non-seasonally adjusted unemployment** added 9,954 persons (+15.4 percent). These shifts led to the dramatic monthly movement in Oklahoma's unemployment rate.

The state saw an opposite trend over the year, as gains in both **non-seasonally adjusted labor force** and **employment** were tempered by **unemployment** losses. Despite the movement, the state **unemployment rate** showed no change compared to January 2006.

All information contained within this document is available free of charge on the OESC website (www.oesc.state.ok.us/lmi/) and through LMI publications developed by the ER&A division. <u>Unless otherwise noted</u>, <u>all statistics are preliminary and have not been adjusted for seasonal factors</u>. All data is collected under strict guidelines provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Although a large amount of data has been presented, this in no way suggests that all data has been included. Due to space restrictions, only relevant industries and sectors are included for each geographic area.

CURRENT EMPLOYMENT STATISTICS

The **Current Employment Statistics (CES)** program uses a monthly payroll survey of businesses to provide current non-farm establishment employment statistics. Non-farm employment is an estimate of employment by place of work. It does not include the self-employed, unpaid family members, or agricultural workers. CES numbers refer to jobs instead of persons.

January's seasonal losses drive down state employment

Despite continued annual growth, Oklahoma's **TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** dropped jobs in January 2007, shrinking by 30,800 jobs (-2.0 percent) over the month. Over-the-month losses were widespread, with the **Natural Resources & Mining** industry providing the only positive movement (+400 jobs) for the month. The **Goods Producing Industries** and **Service Providing Industries** combined for the annual addition of 23,300 jobs (+1.5 percent).

Under the **Goods Producing Industries**, the largest monthly loss came from **Construction**, where seasonal factors force a slowdown each year at this time. For the **Service Providing Industries**, **Trade**, **Transportation & Utilities** accounted for more than a third of the monthly job losses due to **Retail Trade** shedding jobs following the holiday season. Other industries to drop jobs over the month included **Professional & Business Services**, **Leisure & Hospitality**, and **Government**.

Natural Resources & Mining reports state's only monthly growth in January

With a gain of 400 jobs (+0.9 percent), **Natural Resources & Mining** became the only statewide industry to add jobs in January 2007. **Support Activities for Mining** provided more than half of the industry's 6,400-job over-the-year gain.

Seasonal factors force Construction to drop jobs for month

Construction fell victim to seasonal factors in January, as cold weather slowed hiring in this industry that reported strong growth throughout 2006. Two-thirds of the monthly loss was provided by the **Specialty Trade Contractors** sector. Despite losing jobs for the month, **Construction** expanded by 1,200 jobs (+1.8 percent) over the year, with growth shared between **Construction of Buildings** and **Heavy & Civil Engineering**.

State Manufacturing sees monthly losses, annual growth

Oklahoma **Manufacturing** reported a loss of 900 jobs (-0.6 percent) over the month in January due mostly to **Durable Goods Manufacturing**. For the year, this industry has grown by 1,500 jobs (+1.0 percent) because of expansion in **Durable Goods**.

Seasonal losses affect Trade, Transportation & Utilities in January

Trade, Transportation & Utilities (TTU) dropped 9,900 jobs (-3.4 percent) in January, with a majority of the loss concentrated in **Retail Trade**. This sector's seasonal 8,400-job loss was made up mostly of employees hired to work the holiday shopping season. The annual **TTU** gain of 4,600 jobs (+1.7 percent) was shared among **Wholesale Trade**, **Retail Trade**, and **Transportation**, **Warehouse & Utilities**.

Financial Activities hits lowest employment mark in 21 months

Financial Activities reported losses for the month (-1,100 jobs) and year (-900 jobs) in January 2007. Both industry sectors, **Finance & Insurance** and **Real Estate, Rental & Leasing**, contributed to these losses. January's employment level of 82,600 jobs is the lowest for the industry since March 2005.

State Professional & Business Services down for month

Despite an over-the-month loss of 2,500 jobs (-1.4 percent), **Professional & Business Services** added 900 jobs (+0.5 percent) compared to January 2006. Most of the monthly loss and all of the annual gain was contributed by the **Administrative & Support Services** sector. One area of note in the January data is the **Accounting & Tax Preparation** sector, which added 1,400 jobs (+12.0 percent) in anticipation of tax season.

Educational & Health Services continues annual growth

Educational & Health Services dropped 1,600 jobs (-0.8 percent) in January to settle at 188,100 jobs. This translates into a gain of 4,100 jobs (+2.2 percent) compared to January 2006. The monthly loss was provided equally by the **Educational Services** and **Health Care & Social Assistance** sectors. Over the year, **Health Care & Social Assistance** provided all of the growth, as **Ambulatory Health Care**, **Hospitals**, and **Social Assistance** all expanded.

Seasonal slowdown has big effect on Leisure & Hospitality in January

In January 2007, seasonal factors were at the heart of the 4,700-job loss in **Leisure & Hospitality**. As winter weather tightened its grip on the state, employment dropped in both major sectors of this industry. Of the two, **Accommodation & Food Services** accounted for the most losses due almost entirely to a slowdown in **Food Services & Drinking Places**. Over-the-year growth was provided by **Arts, Entertainment & Recreation**.

Annual growth continues for Oklahoma City in January

TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT in the Oklahoma City metropolitan statistical area (MSA) dropped by 9,500 jobs (-1.6 percent) in January, but reported annual growth in the amount of 13,100 jobs (+2.4 percent).

Natural Resources & Mining reported the only monthly growth for the MSA and the strongest annual addition for any of the **Good Producing Industries**. Seasonal factors impacted the **Service Providing Industries**, as **Trade, Transportation & Utilities**, **Leisure & Hospitality**, and **Government** all reported overthe-month losses in January 2007.

OKC Leisure & Hospitality continues over-the-year gains

Despite the seasonal slowdown, **Leisure & Hospitality** managed to grow by 2,800 jobs (+5.2 percent) compared to January 2006, continuing a streak of year-to-year gains started in July 2006.
