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OKLAHOMA EMPLOYMENT REPORT - September 2007

State unemployment rate at 4.1 percent for September

Oklahoma's non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate continued to improve in September, dropping by 0.1 percent to 4.1 percent over the month. The decrease was caused by small additions to the non-seasonally adjusted labor force and employment combining with a drop in unemployment for the month.

Seasonal education factors continue to benefit statewide employment in September

- Oklahoma's statewide TOTAL NON-FARM EMPLOYMENT added 17,600 jobs in September, following the pattern seen each year for the August-to-September period.
- ➡ Educational & Health Services and Government combined to provide almost nine of every 10 jobs gained in September, as public schools and universities opened for the new school year.
- The Service Providing Industries accounted for all of the jobs gained over the month in September.

LOCAL AREA UNEMPLOYMENT STATISTICS

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The statistics in this section are gathered from the **Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS)** program. LAUS produces labor force, employment, unemployment and unemployment rate estimates for the state and its subdivisions based on where workers live. Data is taken from a monthly household survey, and all LAUS numbers refer to individual persons rather than their jobs.

State unemployment rate slips to 4.1 percent in September

In September, Oklahoma's **non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate** improved by 0.1 percent to 4.1 percent. Statewide **non-seasonally adjusted labor force** and **employment** recorded small gains in September, as **non-seasonally adjusted unemployment** contracted over the month. September's unemployment rate is 0.3 percent higher than the rate reported for September 2006.

CURRENT EMPLOYMENT STATISTICS

The **Current Employment Statistics (CES)** program uses a monthly payroll survey of businesses to provide current non-farm establishment employment statistics. Non-farm employment is an estimate of employment by place of work. It does not include the self-employed, unpaid family members or agricultural workers. CES numbers refer to jobs instead of persons.

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Seasonal education factors provide statewide job gains for September

Oklahoma employment continued to expand in September with an addition of 17,600 jobs over the month. All monthly gains came from the **Service Providing Industries**. For the year, Oklahoma's **TOTAL NON-FARM EMPLOYMENT** grew by 17,600 jobs.

Growth in **Government**, driven by seasonal education factors, accounted for nearly 90 percent of the monthly expansion. **Professional & Business Services** and **Educational & Health Services** also reported substantial gains over the month. For the September-to-September period, **Natural Resources & Mining** and **Government** were the sectors that provided the largest over-the-year gains.
