## OKLAHOMA EMPLOYMENT REPORT - April 2007

## State unemployment rate falls to 3.8 percent in April

Oklahoma's non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate dropped to 3.8 percent in April, an improvement of onehalf percent. Although this is a significant change, it falls in line with the trend seen each year for the March-to-April period.

## April brings continued growth for Oklahoma employment

D Growth in Natural Resources \& Mining continues to be a driving force behind year-to-year expansion. Although the industry accounts for less than 3.0 percent of all TOTAL NON-FARM EMPLOYMENT, it provided more than one out of every five jobs added across the state during the April-to-April period.
© Three of the Service Providing Industries (Professional \& Business Services, Educational \& Health Services, and Leisure \& Hospitality) accounted for more than seven out of every 10 jobs gained for the month.
© With a gain of 2,000 jobs over the month, Leisure \& Hospitality added more jobs than any other industry in April. Seasonal growth in Accommodation \& Food Services spurred this expansion.

## LOCAL AREA UNEMPLOYMENT STATISTICS

The statistics in this section are gathered from the Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS) program. LAUS produces labor force, employment, unemployment and unemployment rate estimates for the state and its subdivisions based on where workers live. Data is taken from a monthly household survey, and all LAUS numbers refer to individual persons rather than their jobs.

## April's statewide unemployment rate drops to 3.8 percent

Oklahoma's non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate improved to 3.8 percent in April with an over-the-month drop of one-half of a percent. This drop reflects growth in the state's non-seasonally adjusted labor force and non-seasonally adjusted employment combined with major improvement to non-seasonally adjusted unemployment over the month. This rate drop follows the typical pattern seen each year during the March-to-April period.

Over the year, non-seasonally adjusted labor force, employment and unemployment all experienced moderate gains.

Unless otherwise noted, all statistics are preliminary and have not been adjusted for seasonal factors. All data is collected under strict guidelines provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Although a large amount of data has been presented, this in no way suggests that all data has been included. Due to space restrictions, only relevant industries and sectors are included for each geographic area.

## CURRENT EMPLOYMENT STATISTICS

The Current Employment Statistics (CES) program uses a monthly payroll survey of businesses to provide current non-farm establishment employment statistics. Non-farm employment is an estimate of employment by place of work. It does not include the self-employed, unpaid family members, or agricultural workers. CES numbers refer to jobs instead of persons.

## Monthly and annual gains continue across state in April

Oklahoma's TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT continued to grow in April, adding 7,600 jobs (+0.5 percent) over the month due mostly to expansion in the Service Providing Industries. Over the year, state TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT grew by 25,300 jobs ( +1.6 percent). Only one industry, Financial Activities, dropped jobs over the month; this industry joined Information as the only two industries to shed jobs over the year in April.

The Goods Producing Industries provided more than their fair share of the annual expansion in April. Although these three industries only account for a little more than 17 percent of Oklahoma's TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT, they contributed nearly 42 percent of April's annual gain. This growth was driven for the most part by a Natural Resources \& Mining industry that continues to expand to meet demand for oil.

Growth also continued in the Service Providing Industries in April. Three of these industries, Professional \& Business Services, Educational \& Health Services, and Leisure \& Hospitality, accounted for more than seven out of every 10 jobs gained in April.

## State Natural Resources \& Mining continues annual growth

Although it reported only marginal growth for the month, Natural Resources \& Mining saw strong annual growth in April with an over-the-year addition of 5,100 jobs (+12.5 percent).


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## State Construction continues seasonal expansion in April

Statewide Construction continued its seasonal growth in April, as Construction of Buildings and Specialty Trade Contractors drove monthly gains. All sectors contributed to the industry's annual expansion of 1,900 jobs (+2.7 percent).

## Statewide Manufacturing grows over month and year

In April, Durable Goods Manufacturing provided all of the monthly gains and three-quarters of the annual growth for Oklahoma's Manufacturing industry. Non-durable Goods Manufacturing contributed the remaining 900 jobs to the annual gain.


## Trade, Transportation \& Utilities adds jobs for month and year

Trade, Transportation \& Utilities (TTU) continued to expand in April, as industry employment rose by 700 jobs (+0.2 percent) over the month and 1,900 jobs (+0.7 percent) over the year. The Transportation, Warehouse \& Utilities sector accounted for nearly 95 percent of the annual expansion.

## State Financial Activities industry down for month and year in April

Financial Activities was the only statewide industry to drop jobs for the month in April and joined Information as the only industries to drop jobs over the year. The Real Estate and Rental \& Leasing sector provided most of these losses.


## Professional \& Business Services adds jobs for the month and year again

Professional \& Business Services continued to expand in April, adding 1,800 jobs (+1.0 percent) over the month and 3,100 jobs (+1.8 percent) over the year. Administrative \& Support Services accounted for more than 70 percent of the jobs gained for the month and for the year.

## Educational \& Health Services continues growth in April

## Seasonal growth again impacts state Leisure \& Hospitality

Seasonal growth continued for Leisure \& Hospitality in April, as the industry added 2,000 jobs (+1.5 percent) over the month. Much of the industry's monthly growth was provided by hiring in Full-service Restaurants. The sub-sector was also responsible for the industry's 700 -job gain over the year.

## Oklahoma Government up for month and year in April

Hiring in Government continued to slow in April, as the industry added 500 jobs (+0.2 percent) over the month. Local Government provided the lion's share of the industry's over-the-year growth.


## Oklahoma City reports more employment growth in April

In April, TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT for the Oklahoma City metropolitan statistical area (MSA) grew by 5,000 jobs (+0.9 percent) over the month and 13,500 jobs (+1.4 percent) over the year. The monthly gain came primarily from the Service Providing Industries, and no industry in the MSA dropped jobs in April.

Major contributors to the April-to-April gain included Natural Resources \& Mining, Trade, Transportation \& Utilities, Professional \& Business Services, Educational \& Health Services, and Leisure \& Hospitality. Manufacturing and Government were the only industries to report over-the-year job losses in April 2007.

## OKC Construction growth remains slow-but-steady in April

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## OKC Manufacturing reports annual losses again

Oklahoma City Manufacturing held steady over month in April but dropped 500 jobs ( -1.3 percent) compared to April 2006. Durable Goods Manufacturing provided the industry with its annual loss.


## Trade, Transportation \& Utilities up for month and year

Growth in Retail Trade slowed in April, but Oklahoma City Trade, Transportation \& Utilities (TTU) still managed a 600 -job gain (+0.6 percent) for the month. Retail Trade and Transportation, Warehouse \& Utilities shared the monthly and annual gains, with Retail Trade providing most of the year-to-year growth.

## OKC Professional \& Business Services expands in April

Oklahoma City Professional \& Business Services added jobs for the month and year in April. The Administrative \& Support Services sector provided most of the growth.


## Educational \& Health Services reports strong annual gain

In April, Oklahoma City Educational \& Health Services gained 1,000 jobs (+1.4 percent) over the month and 4,500 jobs ( +6.4 percent) over the year. This industry's annual gain provided one-third of all jobs added for the April-to-April period in the MSA. Health Care \& Social Assistance provided much of the monthly gain.


## Seasonal gains slow for OKC Leisure \& Hospitality in April

Although seasonal factors continued to impact Oklahoma City Leisure \& Hospitality in April, the industry only added 400 jobs ( +0.7 percent) over the month. The monthly growth was provided almost entirely by Fullservice Restaurants. Over the year, this industry has expanded by 2,200 jobs, due in large part to the Food Services \& Drinking Places sector.


## Oklahoma City Government adds jobs for month, drops jobs over year again in April

Following last month's trend, Oklahoma City Government continued to post monthly growth and annual losses in April. The over-the-month addition of 300 jobs (+0.3 percent) came from State Government and Local Government. Although Federal Government and Local Government each managed to add jobs over the year, large cuts in State Government held back any growth for the April-to-April period.


## Tulsa MSA reports monthly and annual growth in April

TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT for the Tulsa metropolitan statistical area (MSA) once again added jobs over the month with an addition of 2,400 jobs (+0.6 percent) in April. Many of these new jobs came from the Service Providing Industries, where Trade, Transportation \& Utilities, Professional \& Business Services, and Leisure \& Hospitality were among the industries to report growth for the month.

Both the Goods Producing Industries and the Service Providing Industries contributed to the net annual growth of 6,800 jobs (+1.6 percent) in April. As with statewide employment, the Goods Producing Industries provided more than their fair share of the annual growth, but it was Manufacturing rather than Natural Resources \& Mining that provided the jobs. When combined, Manufacturing and Trade, Transportation \& Utilities, the two industries that contributed the most jobs to Tulsa employment over the year, account for more than three-quarters of all annual growth in the MSA.
