Oklahoma unemployment rate falls in February

In February, the **non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate** in Oklahoma decreased to 3.5 percent. For the February-to-February period, Oklahoma's **non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate** dropped by 1.2 percent.

State and MSAs add jobs in February 2008

- Oklahoma's statewide TOTAL NON-FARM EMPLOYMENT added 12,800 jobs in February. When combined, the Oklahoma City and Tulsa MSAs provided fewer than 25 percent of the jobs gained for the month.
- In February, employment expanded for the state, the Oklahoma City MSA and the Tulsa MSA, exactly the opposite of January, when all three contracted over the month.
- Government provided the largest amount of job growth in February with an addition of 7,700 jobs.

LOCAL AREA UNEMPLOYMENT STATISTICS

The statistics in this section are gathered from the **Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS)** program. LAUS produces labor force, employment, unemployment and unemployment rate estimates for the state and its subdivisions based on where workers live. Data is taken from a monthly household survey, and all LAUS numbers refer to individual persons rather than their jobs.

State unemployment rate drops in February

Oklahoma's **non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate** decreased by 0.7 percent in February 2008 to 3.5 percent. Statewide **non-seasonally adjusted labor force, non-seasonally adjusted employment**, and **non-seasonally adjusted unemployment** were all down over the month. Statewide **non-seasonally adjusted unemployment** dropped by more than 18.0 percent over the month and more than 25.0 percent over the year.

All data is collected under strict guidelines provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Although a large amount of data has been presented, this in no way suggests that all data has been included. Due to space restrictions, only relevant industries and sectors are included for each geographic area.

CURRENT EMPLOYMENT STATISTICS

The **Current Employment Statistics (CES)** program uses a monthly payroll survey of businesses to provide current non-farm establishment employment statistics. Non-farm employment is an estimate of employment by place of work. It does not include the self-employed, unpaid family members or agricultural workers. CES numbers refer to jobs instead of persons.

Oklahoma employment rebounds in February 2008

In February 2008, Oklahoma **TOTAL NON-FARM EMPLOYMENT** added 12,800 jobs over the month due mostly to activity in the **Service Providing Industries**. For the February-to-February period, state employment expanded by 27,000 jobs (+1.7 percent).

Monthly growth was widespread across all industries, with the exceptions of **Trade, Transportation & Utilities** and **Information**. All of the **Goods Producing Industries** contributed to the monthly additions. For the **Service Providing Industries**, **Professional & Business Services** and **Government** were the big gainers in February, combining to provide 9,800 jobs over the month.

TOTAL NON-FARM EMPLOYMENT in the Oklahoma City metropolitan statistical area (MSA) expanded by 2,800 jobs over the month in February. Almost all of the monthly growth came from the **Service Providing Industries**, where **Leisure & Hospitality** and **Government** each reported additions of at least 1,000 jobs.

For the February-to-February period, it was the **Goods Producing Industries** that contributed a majority of the jobs gained. **Natural Resources & Mining** and **Construction** combined to account for 4,400 of the jobs added over the year.

For the February-to-February period, the trend was essentially reversed, with the **Goods Producing Industries** reporting the annual growth. Under the **Service Providing Industries**, large employment losses in **Professional & Business Services** and **Leisure & Hospitality** overwhelmed annual job gains in **Trade**, **Transportation & Utilities** and **Educational & Health Services**.
