## Oklahoma's statewide unemployment rate up in May

In May, Oklahoma's non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate increased to 3.5 percent. For the May-to-May period, the statewide non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate dropped by 0.9 percent.

## May job counts up for state as well as both MSAs

© Oklahoma's statewide TOTAL NON-
FARM EMPLOYMENT grew by 8,400 jobs (+0.5 percent) in May. More than 40 percent of the jobs gained for the month came from outside of the Oklahoma City and Tulsa MSAs.
© The largest monthly addition in May was provided by Leisure \& Hospitality. This industry has expanded each month since January 2008.

ว Government was the only statewide industry to report an over-the-year loss in May. This is the second straight month that the industry has shed jobs compared to the same time last year.

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## LOCAL AREA UNEMPLOYMENT STATISTICS

The statistics in this section are gathered from the Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS) program. LAUS produces labor force, employment, unemployment and unemployment rate estimates for the state and its subdivisions based on where workers live. Data is taken from a monthly household survey, and all LAUS numbers refer to individual persons rather than their jobs.

## State unemployment, unemployment rate increase in May

In May, Oklahoma's non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate expanded by 0.6 percent to 3.5 percent for the month. Statewide non-seasonally adjusted labor force, employment and unemployment all expanded over the month, with unemployment's 23.9 percent increase leading to the monthly unemployment rate gain. Since May 2007, statewide non-seasonally adjusted unemployment has dropped by more than 19.0 percent.

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## CURRENT EMPLOYMENT STATISTICS

The Current Employment Statistics (CES) program uses a monthly payroll survey of businesses to provide current non-farm establishment employment statistics. Non-farm employment is an estimate of employment by place of work. It does not include the self-employed, unpaid family members or agricultural workers. CES numbers refer to jobs instead of persons.

## Oklahoma employment continues to increase in May

Oklahoma TOTAL NON-FARM EMPLOYMENT expanded by 8,400 jobs over the month in May. The month's largest employment increase of 2,300 jobs came from Leisure \& Hospitality. Only two sectors, Natural Resources \& Mining and Educational \& Health Services, reported monthly employment losses in May.

Over the year, statewide employment grew by 21,900 jobs. The only industry that failed to add jobs over the year was Government, where large losses in Local Government hindered annual growth.

Statewide Natural Resources \& Mining shed 100 jobs in May. The industry added 5,800 jobs, or 12.8 percent, over the year.


## Statewide Construction continues to grow in May

In May, employment in statewide Construction expanded by 1,200 jobs over the month and 3,200 jobs over the year. Specialty Trade Contractors contributed a majority of the monthly and annual gains.

## Statewide Manufacturing up for month, year

Oklahoma Manufacturing expanded by 700 jobs in May due to the Non-durable Goods Manufacturing sector. Durable Goods Manufacturing contributed a majority of the 1,100 jobs added for the year.


## Retail Trade provides most TTU monthly growth in May

Trade, Transportation \& Utilities (TTU) gained 1,400 jobs in May due in large part to Retail Trade. Over-the-year losses in Wholesale Trade tempered annual additions for TTU.

## Monthly, annual growth continues in Oklahoma City MSA

TOTAL NON-FARM EMPLOYMENT in the Oklahoma City metropolitan statistical area (MSA) expanded by 3,300 jobs in May, as all industries posted gains for the month. Much of the monthly growth came from the Service Providing Industries.

## Tulsa MSA recovers from April losses in May

TOTAL NON-FARM EMPLOYMENT in the Tulsa metropolitan statistical area (MSA) rebounded from April's losses with a monthly gain of 1,700 jobs in May. Although a number of industries reported no change for the month, no losses were reported. Leisure \& Hospitality claimed May's largest over-the-month gain.

For the year, Tulsa TOTAL NON-FARM EMPLOYMENT added 1,100 jobs, due mostly to gains under the Goods Producing Industries. Although Educational \& Health Services reported a large annual gain, losses in Professional \& Business Services and Government led to a net annual loss for the Service Providing Industries in May.
