

## MSA Redefinitions Spell Change for State in 2005

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In 2000, the federal Office of Management and Budget (OMB) revised the standards for defining federal statistical areas. It was then announced in 2003 that statistical area definitions would be updated to follow the new standards in 2005. The updated Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs) are defined in terms of whole counties and must meet two criteria based on the 2000 Census.

Each MSA must include:

- at least one urbanized area of 50,000 or more people, and
- all adjacent counties showing a high degree of social and economic integration with the core as measured by commuting ties.

When the changes are implemented in 2005, Oklahoma will be left with three MSAs: Lawton, Oklahoma City and Tulsa. Enid, which has qualified under previous guidelines, will lose MSA status because its urban area population is less than 50,000.

Population won't be the only factor affecting the state, as commuting patterns will also force change. LeFlore County in eastern Oklahoma will join Sequoyah County as part of the Fort Smith (Arkansas) MSA. In addition, two of the remaining three MSAs for the state will see changes in their county makeup. The Oklahoma City MSA will add Grady and Lincoln Counties but drop Pottawatomie County, and the Tulsa MSA will add Okmulgee and Pawnee counties. This means that Canadian, Cleveland, Grady, Lincoln, Logan, McClain and Oklahoma counties will now make up the Oklahoma City MSA. The Tulsa MSA will include Creek, Okmulgee, Osage, Pawnee, Rogers, Tulsa and Wagoner counties. The Lawton MSA will remain as is.

For the Oklahoma City and Tulsa MSAs, Current Employment Statistics (CES) data for December 2004 and before will not be comparable with data published using the new definitions due to the addition and subtraction of counties. These new MSA definitions will be implemented with the release of the benchmarked 2004 data and the January 2005 employment data. The January data will be released in early March 2005, followed by the 2004
benchmarked data later the same month. Although CES data published before January 2005 cannot be accurately compared for the Oklahoma City and Tulsa MSAs, the benchmarked December 2004 employment levels will be adjusted to be compatible with the January 2005 data for these areas.

To address data comparability issues, historical data from January 1990 to December 2002 have been revised to incorporate the changes. These data will merge with the 2004 benchmarked and re-estimated data (benchmarked data covers January 2003 to March 2004; re-estimated data encompasses April 2004 to December 2004) to provide a complete time series. ## DESPITE SLOW DECEMBER, STATE EMPLOYMENT IMPROVES OVER YEAR

OKLAHOMA TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT closed out the year with a small gain of 3,000 jobs to reach $1,478,900$ for December 2004. Over the year, state employment has grown by 1.7 percent ( $+24,600$ jobs), matching the national growth rate for the same period. As expected, seasonal holiday hiring in Retail Trade led the sector to an addition of 2,900 jobs in December.

- Natural Resource and Mining increased by 300 jobs over the month and by 2,200 jobs over the year due mostly to the Support Activities for Mining sector.
- Despite seasonal Construction losses over the month, the industry has added 2,000 jobs over the year due in large part to Construction of Buildings.
- A seasonal gain of 2,900 jobs in Retail Trade led Trade, Transportation and Utilities to gains over the month. Transportation, Warehouse and Utilities was the only sector to manage sizeable growth over the year with an addition of 1,100 jobs (+2.1 percent).

- Information remained virtually unchanged in December, but reported annual growth of 1,700 jobs in December due to strong growth in the Publishing Industries and Telecommunications sectors.
- Educational and Health Services remained unchanged over the month, but added 3,600 jobs compared to December 2003. This annual growth was provided mostly by the Health Care and Social Assistance sector.
- Leisure and Hospitality added 4,000 jobs compared to December 2003, as the Art, Entertainment and Recreation sector (+15.2 percent) and the Accommodation and Food Services sector (+2.1 percent) reported strong annual growth.
- Government grew by 300 jobs over the month and 6,500 jobs over the year. The lion's share of the annual growth in this industry was contributed by Local Government (+5,700 jobs).

## BUCKING STATE TREND, OKC RETAIL TRADE

ADDS JOBS OVER YEAR
TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT in the Oklahoma City MSA closed out 2004 with an increase of 11,700 jobs ( +2.2 percent) over the year. The Goods Producing Industries and the Service Providing Industries added 100 jobs and 1,900 jobs over the month, respectively.

- Natural Resources and Mining gained 100 jobs (+1.3 percent) in December and 400 jobs ( +5.6 percent) over the year.
- Although Construction was in decline over the month as winter weather impacted the industry, the MSA added 1,400 jobs (+ 6.5 percent) over the year.
- Trade, Transportation and Utilities gained 1,600 jobs (+1.6 percent) in December due to a Retail Trade sector that added 1,500 jobs over the month. Going against the trend of the state as a whole, OKC Retail Trade managed healthy growth over the year, gaining 2,300 jobs (+3.6 percent) in the December-to-December period.
- Financial Activities added 300 jobs (+0.9 percent) over the month and 700 jobs (+2.1 percent) over the year.
- Professional and Business Services expanded by 300 jobs in December 2004. The Administrative and Support Services sector drove over-the-year growth thanks to an active Employment Services subsector (+ 3,000 jobs).
- The Health Care and Social Assistance sector of Educational and Health Services added 2,100 jobs (+3.5 percent) over the year, as Hospitals in the OKC area gained 1,700 jobs (+8.4 percent).
- Leisure and Hospitality Services dropped 500 workers ( -0.9 percent) over the month while adding 1,500 jobs over the year.
- Government dropped 100 jobs over the month and 600 jobs over the year. State Government has dropped 1,000 jobs ( -2.5 percent) since December 2003.

## MONTHLY LOSSES DON'T SLOW TULSA'S ANNUAL GAINS

TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT in the Tulsa MSA decreased by 1,100 jobs ( -0.3 percent) over the month, edging down to 381,700 jobs in December 2004. Nevertheless, the Tulsa MSA has grown by 1,500 employees (+0.4 percent) over the year.

- Despite holding steady at 46,300 jobs over the month, Manufacturing in Tulsa grew by 1,100 jobs (+2.4 percent) during the December-to-December period. All of the annual gains came from the Durable Goods Manufacturing sector.
- Although Trade, Transportation and Utilities increased by 700 jobs ( +0.9 percent) over the month, the industry has dropped 1,800 jobs ( -2.2 percent) since December 2003. The Retail Trade sector performed below its normal holiday season pattern by gaining only 200 jobs (+0.5 percent). For the year, Retail Trade has lost 2,000 jobs.
- Financial Activities added 100 jobs in December to reach 25,300 jobs. The December job level was 1,200 jobs higher ( +5.0 percent) than in December 2003. Twothirds of the annual growth was contributed by the Finance and Insurance sector.
- Educational and Health Services received an over-the-year boost from its Health Care and Social Assistance sector in December 2004. Gains in the sector produced by the Hospitals subsector accounted for the annual growth.
- Leisure and Hospitality shed 1,500 jobs ( -4.4 percent) over the month, the largest monthly drop reported for any Tulsa industry in December 2004.
- Government increased by 300 jobs (+0.7 percent) over the month and 700 jobs (+1.6 percent) over the year due to increases in both State Government and Local Government.
