The Oklahoma City Local Labor Market (LLM) is comprised of Canadian, Logan and Oklahoma counties.

During fourth quarter 2011, **Oklahoma Employment Security Commission (OESC)** staff at the Oklahoma City workforce centers matched job seekers with open positions for a number of employers, including SMX Staffing and MDV Nash Finch. In addition, career fair events were held for Schneider Trucking, LMS Intellibound, USIC, Pro Drivers, and Chipotle Grill.

The 30<sup>th</sup> Semi-Annual Oklahoma City Job Fair, sponsored by **OESC**, was held November 10, 2011. More than 100 employers registered for this event, and it was attended by over 1,600 job seekers. This job fair is known as Central Oklahoma's premier job fair because of its wide variety of employers as well as its great selection of quality job seekers.

# **ON-THE-JOB TRAINING**

OESC's On-the-Job Training (OJT) program reimburses employers for costs associated with training new employees. Because training is planned, organized and conducted by employers at their workplace, they can customize the training to address their specific needs. An employer's local workforce center will provide pre-screened applicants for the OJT position, assist in designing the individualized training, and reimburse the employer between 50 percent and 90 percent of the new hire's training costs during the training period. Assistance is available at no cost to employers. Unemployed Oklahoma workers laid off since January 1, 2008, who have been unemployed for more than 19 weeks are eligible to participate. This creates a situation where employers get the workers they need at a reduced cost, while long-term unemployed job seekers get back to work and expand their skills in a hands-on environment.
