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AREAS OF INTEREST

- 1. Tulsa MSA non-farm employment has completely recovered from the 2001 recession.** The recent strong job growth in Tulsa has finally erased the lingering effects of the 2001 economic recession and subsequent labor market weakness. January 2006 employment hit a new high when compared to January for past years.
- 2. The Goods Producing Industries are reporting good growth. Natural Resources & Mining** employment continues to outpace the economy as a whole. **Manufacturing** reported an artificially high annual growth rate of 2.4 percent in January due to an abnormally low employment reading in the **Motor Vehicle Manufacturing** industry. However, even with this factored out, **Manufacturing** still experienced relatively strong annual growth.
- 3. The seasonal increase of 0.5 percent in the statewide unemployment rate hides the growth surge the state is experiencing.** January is normally a month when we expect to see seasonal losses. When adjusted for seasonal factors, Oklahoma's unemployment rate actually fell over the month, dropping from 4.2 percent in December to 3.9 percent in January.

IN A NUTSHELL . . .

“Overall, the January 2006 data shows a state labor market that is rapidly increasing in strength. The typical result one would expect to see in such a case is an increase in wage rates. Unfortunately, there’s a down side. If wages do increase across the state, we can expect to see inflation follow suit.” *Lynn Gray, OESC Chief Economist*

Although a large amount of data has been presented, this in no way suggests that all data has been included. Due to space restrictions, only relevant industries and sectors are included for each geographic area.

STATE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE RISES IN JANUARY 2006

Oklahoma's **Unemployment Rate** rose by four-tenths of a percent to 4.4 percent in January, as losses in both **Employment** and **Labor Force** combined with an increase in **Unemployment** of nearly 10 percent.

For the month, Oklahoma's **Non-seasonally Adjusted Employment** and **Non-seasonally Adjusted Labor Force** dropped by 21,807 (-1.3 percent) and 14,264 people (-0.8 percent), respectively. In contrast, **Non-seasonally Adjusted Unemployment** added 7,543 persons (+9.8 percent).

Over the year, both **Employment** and **Labor Force** have shown strong growth. Statewide **Unemployment**, on the other hand, dropped almost 12,000 people from its ranks during the January-to-January period.

ALL MSA UNEMPLOYMENT RATES UP OVER MONTH IN JANUARY

The unemployment rates for all of the state's metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs) rose in January 2006. **Oklahoma City MSA** went from 3.9 percent to 4.3 percent. **Tulsa MSA** increased to 4.3 percent. The **Lawton MSA** had the largest gain, as it jumped to 5.0 percent for the month.

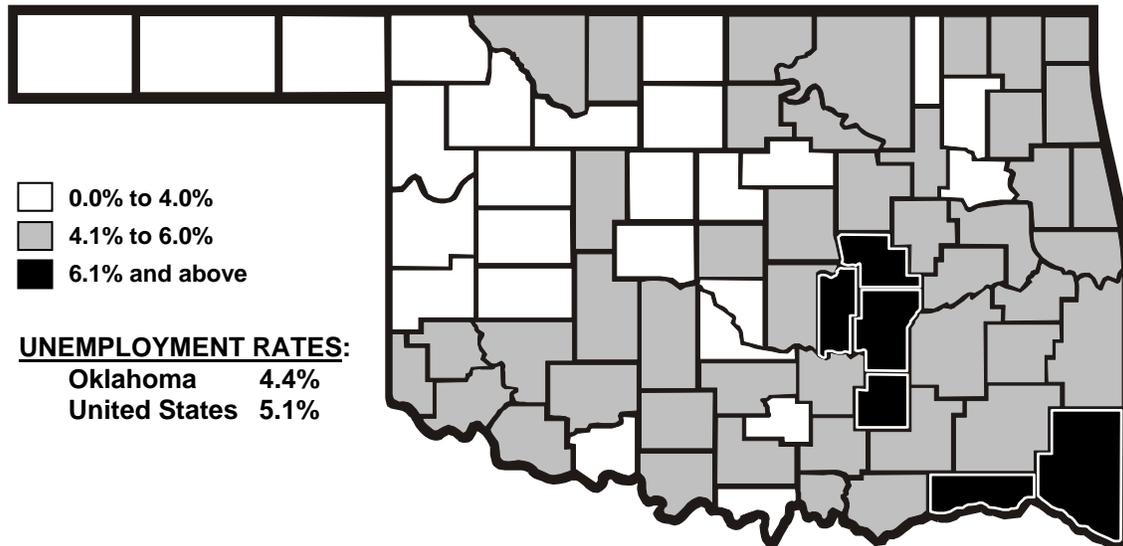

DESPITE SEASONAL LOSSES, STATE CONTINUES ANNUAL GROWTH

In January 2006, Oklahoma's **TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** continued to add jobs over the year, growing by 42,500 jobs (+2.9 percent) during the January-to-January period despite losing 30,800 jobs (-2.0 percent) over the month. This monthly employment dip is a seasonal event seen each year. The annual change came from both the **Goods Producing Industries** and the **Service Providing Industries**.

Under the **Goods Producing Industries, Natural Resources & Mining, Construction, and Manufacturing** each shed jobs for the month, with seasonal factors accounting for most of the change. These three also combined to provide all of the annual gain seen in the **Goods Producing Industries**. For the **Service Providing Industries, Trade, Transportation & Utilities** accounted for more than a third of the jobs lost over the month due to **Retail Trade** shedding jobs following the holiday season. Other supersectors affected by seasonal factors for the month were **Education & Health Services, Leisure & Hospitality, and Government**.

NATURAL RESOURCES & MINING SEES STRONG ANNUAL GROWTH

Natural Resources & Mining dropped 300 jobs (-0.8 percent) in January 2006. Over the year, this supersector has been booming, as **Support Activities for Mining** provided 2,300 of 3,100 jobs (+9.0 percent) gained for the January-to-January period.

DESPITE SEASONAL FACTORS, CONSTRUCTION ADDS JOBS FOR YEAR

Construction fell victim to seasonal factors in January, as cold weather continued to dampen hiring. Despite losing 1,000 jobs (-1.5 percent) over the month, **Construction** expanded by 3,800 jobs (+6.2 percent) for the year, with a majority of the growth occurring in **Construction of Buildings and Specialty Trade Contractors**.

SEASONAL FACTORS COST RETAIL TRADE JOBS IN JANUARY

Trade, Transportation & Utilities lost 9,300 jobs (-3.2 percent) over the month in January 2006, mostly due to a seasonal loss of 8,100 jobs (-4.5 percent) in **Retail Trade** following the holiday season. **Retail Trade** also contributed 5,000 jobs (+3.0 percent) to the over-the-year gain in **Trade, Transportation & Utilities**.

FINANCIAL ACTIVITIES CONTINUES TO SEE OVER-THE-YEAR GAINS

In January 2006, **Financial Activities** once again reported strong annual growth, as the supersector added 2,200 jobs (+2.7 percent) over the year. The **Finance & Insurance** industry accounted for about two-thirds of the gain. For the month, **Financial Activities** dropped 600 jobs (-0.7 percent).

STATEWIDE PROFESSIONAL & BUSINESS SERVICES DOWN FOR MONTH

Professional & Business Services took a big over-the-month hit in January, but managed to continue its strong annual growth. The monthly loss can be attributed to an **Administrative & Support Services** industry that shed 4,300 jobs over the month. The supersector has grown by 6,700 jobs (+4.2 percent) over the year, also mostly thanks to **Administrative & Support Services**. One area of note in the January data is the **Accounting & Tax Preparation** sector, which added 1,800 jobs (+15.4 percent) in anticipation of tax season.

EDUCATION & HEALTH SERVICES CONTINUES ANNUAL GROWTH

The monthly loss was provided equally by **Educational Services** and **Health Care & Social Assistance**. For the year, a 6,200-job gain from **Health Care & Social Assistance** was tempered by the 1,000 jobs lost from **Educational Services**.

SEASONAL SLOWDOWN CONTINUES IN LEISURE & HOSPITALITY

Seasonal factors again affected **Leisure & Hospitality**, as the supersector shed 2,100 jobs (-1.6 percent) over the month. In contrast, **Leisure & Hospitality** has added 4,100 jobs (+3.3 percent) during the January-to-January period. Much of the annual growth came from the **Food Services & Drinking Places** sector.

OKLAHOMA CITY MSA ANNUAL GROWTH CONTINUES IN JANUARY

TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT for the Oklahoma City MSA dropped by 14,000 jobs (-2.5 percent) over the month in January, but still outpaced January 2005 with an addition of 15,400 jobs (+2.9 percent) over the year. The **Service Providing Industries** were responsible for a majority of the monthly and annual changes.

Under the **Good Producing Industries, Natural Resources & Mining** and **Construction** reported strong over-the-year growth for January. Seasonal losses for the **Service Providing Industries** were reported in **Trade, Transportation & Utilities, Education & Health Services, Leisure & Hospitality, and Government.**
