Both the GOODS PRODUCING INDUSTRIES and the SERVICE PROVIDING INDUSTRIES contributed to the growth.</p> |
| <p>LEISURE & HOSPITALITY</p> <p>↑ 3,700 jobs (+3.0%) over year</p> | <p>LEISURE & HOSPITALITY is 3,700 jobs ahead of its February 2004 employment levels. Most of this growth came from the ACCOMMODATION & FOOD SERVICES sector.</p> |

All information contained within this document is available free of charge on the OESC website (www.oesc.state.ok.us/lmi/) and through publications developed by the ER&A division. Unless otherwise noted, all statistics are preliminary and have not been adjusted for seasonal factors. All data is collected under strict guidelines provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. **Although a large amount of data has been presented through the included tables, this is in no way meant to suggest that all data has been included. Due to space restrictions, only relevant industries and subsectors have been included for each geographic area.**

NUMBER OF UNEMPLOYED FALLS IN FEBRUARY 2005

Oklahoma's **Non-seasonally Adjusted Unemployment** fell by just over 8.5 percent in February, as it shed 7,600 people over the month. This drop brought the state's **Non-seasonally Adjusted Unemployment** to 81,600 in February 2005. From February 2004 to February 2005, the number of unemployed in Oklahoma dropped by 12,445 people.

The state labor force and employment numbers both gained from their January 2005 levels. Oklahoma's **Non-seasonally Adjusted Labor Force** added 2,070 people (+0.1 percent) over the month, and **Non-seasonally Adjusted Total Employment** grew by 9,680 people (+0.6 percent).

The result of this activity was reflected in the February **State Unemployment Rate** as a one-half percent drop to 4.8 percent for the month.

FEBRUARY UNEMPLOYMENT DROPS IN OKLAHOMA'S CSAs

Oklahoma's Combined Statistical Areas saw drops in their unemployment in February. Unemployed numbers for the **Oklahoma City-Shawnee CSA** dropped by 4,090 people (-12.9 percent) over the month, while **Tulsa-Bartlesville CSA** unemployment shrunk by 1,310 persons (-5.6 percent).

MSA UNEMPLOYMENT RATES ALL DROP OVER MONTH

All three of Oklahoma's MSAs saw improvements in their unemployment rates in February. The unemployment rate for the **Oklahoma City MSA** dropped by seven-tenths of a percent to 4.4 percent, partially due to the return of Manufacturing workers lost in January. **Tulsa MSA** improved by three-tenths of a percent to 4.7 percent, while **Lawton MSA** dropped by four-tenths to reach 4.6 percent.



ROGER MILLS COUNTY REPORTS STATE'S LOWEST RATE

Roger Mills County (2.8 percent) once again provided the state's lowest county unemployment rate in February. **Beckham County** was next at 2.9 percent, and **Ellis County** rounded out the three lowest rates with a 3.0 percent for the month.

STATE EMPLOYMENT ONCE AGAIN IMPROVES FOR MONTH, YEAR

State **TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** added 11,800 jobs (+0.8 percent) in February 2005, bringing its over-the-year gain to 27,100 jobs (+1.9 percent). Both **Goods Producing** and **Service Providing Industries** gained jobs for the month and year. Over the year, **Natural Resources and Mining** and **Construction** provided jobs in the **Goods Producing Industries**. For the **Service Providing Industries**, big gainers for both the month and year were **Professional and Business Services**, **Education and Health Services**, **Leisure and Hospitality**, and **Government**. **Retail Trade** provided monthly losses in **Trade, Transportation and Utilities**.

NATURAL RESOURCES & MINING CONTINUES TO GROW OVER YEAR

With a small gain in February, **Natural Resources and Mining** reported 31,600 jobs for the month, an increase of 1,900 jobs (+6.4 percent) since February 2004. **Support Activities for Mining** contributed a majority of the monthly and annual growth for the industry.

DURABLE GOODS MANUFACTURING PROVIDES FEBRUARY GROWTH

Statewide **Manufacturing** gained 1,300 jobs (+0.9 percent) over the month, as the **Transportation Equipment** subsector gained 1,300 jobs (+8.8 percent) in February. Over the year, the **Durable Goods** sector added 1,100 jobs (+1.2 percent), while **Non-durable Goods** sector shed 700 jobs (-1.4 percent).

RETAIL TRADE CONTRIBUTES SEASONAL LOSS FOR MONTH

Trade, Transportation and Utilities fell by 1,800 jobs (-0.7 percent) to 271,500 in February, as seasonal losses continued to impact the **Retail Trade** sector. Losses mostly associated with the holiday shopping season pushed **Retail Trade** to provide the industry's monthly and annual losses, while the other industry sectors offset each other.

PROFESSIONAL & BUSINESS SERVICES CONTINUES TO GROW

Professional and Business Services reported healthy growth over the month and year in February. In fact, this industry contributed more than 20 percent of the state's total over-the-year employment gain. Although growth was seen across all sectors, it was **Administrative and Support Services** that fueled gains in this industry by adding 1,110 jobs (+1.2 percent) for the month and 5,700 jobs (+6.6 percent) over the year. **Employment Services** continues to provide most of this growth.

EDUCATION & HEALTH SERVICES CONTINUES OVER-THE-YEAR GAINS

Education and Health Services continued to pick up steam in February 2005 with an over-the-month addition of 1,200 jobs (+0.7 percent). Since February 2004, this industry has added 4,200 jobs (+2.4 percent) due to strong growth in the **Ambulatory Health Care** and **Hospitals** subsectors.

LEISURE & HOSPITALITY CONTINUES TO GROW IN 2005

Leisure and Hospitality continued to benefit from an active Accommodation and Food Services sector in February, as the industry added 1,300 jobs (+1.0 percent) for the month and 3,700 jobs (+3.0 percent) over the year. The Food Services and Drinking Places subsector produced a majority of the gains during February 2005.

GOVERNMENT EXPERIENCES BIG GAINS FOR MONTH AND YEAR

In February, Government in Oklahoma reported gains of 7,600 jobs (+2.5 percent) over the month and 9,800 jobs (+3.2 percent) over the year. State Government provided the lion's share of the monthly growth; the sector's gain reflects the balance of school personnel returning from holiday break not accounted for in the January 2005 data. Over the year, Government has gained 9,800 jobs (+3.2 percent), as Local Government reported an addition of 7,900 jobs (+4.5 percent).

OKLAHOMA CITY REPORTS GROWTH FOR BOTH MONTH AND YEAR

TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT for the Oklahoma City MSA added 5,000 jobs (+0.4 percent) in February to settle at 543,300 jobs, a gain of 10,600 jobs (+2.0 percent) compared to February 2004. The **Goods Producing Industries** received a big boost from **Manufacturing** over the month due to the return of **Transportation Equipment Manufacturing** workers following retooling at local plants. The **Service Providing Industries** also experienced job gains despite a drop in **Trade, Transportation and Utilities** due to seasonal losses in **Retail Trade**. **TTU** was the only industry in the Oklahoma City MSA to lose jobs for the month in February 2005. **Government** contributed nearly half of the jobs added over the month in the **Service Providing Industries** for Oklahoma City.

OKC CONSTRUCTION BUILDS ON OVER-THE-YEAR GROWTH

Oklahoma City **Construction** managed to add 200 jobs in February, bringing its over-the-year change to an addition of 1,200 jobs (+5.4 percent). Over the year, **Construction** in Oklahoma City has improved more than in any other MSA.
