<p><b>STATEWIDE EMPLOYMENT</b>                  ↑ 48,170 since January 2005</p>	<p>With the exception of a small drop in May, Oklahoma's TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT has grown each month since January. The June 2005 level of 1,666,010 people represents a gain of 24,400 compared to June 2004.</p>
<p><b>PROFESSIONAL &amp; BUSINESS SVCS.</b>                  ↑ 7,200 jobs over year</p>	<p>Besides GOVERNMENT, the industry reporting the largest gain since June 2004 was PROFESSIONAL &amp; BUSINESS SERVICES. June's 7,200-job gain in this industry translates into a year-over-year growth rate of 4.4 percent.</p>
<p><b>TULSA MSA EMPLOYMENT</b>                  ↑ 10,200 jobs since January</p>	<p>Employment in the TULSA MSA has added jobs each month since January 2005, averaging a monthly gain of 2,040 jobs. Over this period, the SERVICE PROVIDING INDUSTRIES contributed more than 80 percent of the jobs added.</p>

### IN A NUTSHELL . . .

"While well short of where it was in the 90s, Oklahoma's employment growth continues to pick up steam. Current state job growth is by far the best in five years, but it has been unbalanced in terms of both industry and geography. For example, although Tulsa has added jobs for five consecutive months, it is growing less than half as fast as Oklahoma City. In addition, manufacturing, most notably non-durable manufacturing, has seen year-over-year job losses each month since August 2000." - Lynn Gray, OESC Chief Economist

Due to space restrictions, only relevant industries and subsectors have been included for each geographic area.**

## STATE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE HOLDS STEADY IN JUNE

The June 2005 **Unemployment Rate** for the state of Oklahoma held steady over the month at 4.5 percent, a four-fifths of a percent drop compared to June 2004. Despite this fact, **Non-seasonally Adjusted Employment, Unemployment** and **Labor Force** all grew from May 2005 to June 2005.

Oklahoma's **Non-seasonally Adjusted Employment** and **Non-seasonally Adjusted Labor Force** reported around 1.3 percent growth over the month, as **Employment** added 21,020 people, and the **Labor Force** gained 22,440. With the exception of May, **Employment** has steadily added jobs since January. **Employment** and **Labor Force** have grown by between 0.8 and 0.9 percent over the past year.

The state's **Non-seasonally Adjusted Unemployment** managed more aggressive growth over both the month and year. In June 2005, **Unemployment** added 1,420 people (+1.8 percent); for the year, **Unemployment** has grown by 2,010 people (+2.6 percent).

June provided a mixed bag as far as MSA unemployment rates were concerned. The **Oklahoma City MSA** unemployment rate rose to 4.5 percent in June, gaining three-tenths over the month. **Tulsa MSA** dropped by one-tenth to 4.4 percent. The **Lawton MSA** held steady at 4.7 percent over the month.

## OKFUSKEE COUNTY SEES RATE RISE, TAKES OVER TOP SPOT IN JUNE



## ROGER MILLS COUNTY REPORTS JUNE'S LOWEST COUNTY RATE

At 2.8 percent for the month, **Roger Mills County** held the state's lowest county unemployment rate in June. **Dewey County** came in second at 2.9 percent, and **Beckham County** rounded out the three lowest rates for the month at 3.0 percent. Rates for both Dewey and Ellis counties rose over the month.

## SEASONAL FACTORS FORCE MONTHLY JOB LOSSES IN JUNE

Oklahoma's **TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** dropped by 8,100 jobs (-0.5 percent) in June, as seasonal losses in **Manufacturing** and **Government** overshadowed gains in other industries. Statewide employment for June was 25,500 jobs higher (+1.7 percent) than in June 2004.

Under the **Goods Producing Industries**, **Manufacturing** fell by 2,100 jobs (-1.5 percent) over the month. It is common to see industry employment drop at this time of year due to seasonal factors. Seasonal factors also affected **Construction**, which added 1,600 jobs (+2.5 percent) over the month. Between June 2004 and June 2005, this industry has gained 1,000 jobs (+1.6 percent).

The **Service Providing Industries** found themselves at the mercy of summer, as **Government** and **Educational & Health Services** both reported seasonal losses due to the beginning of the summer session for public schools and universities. Across the state, **Government** dropped 12,100 jobs (-3.8 percent) over the month. The effect on **Educational & Health Services** was less severe, resulting in a loss of 1,000 jobs (-0.5 percent) in June. Compared to June 2004, both of these industries have added jobs.

## JUNE BRINGS STATEWIDE CONSTRUCTION GROWTH

**Construction** grew by 1,600 jobs (+2.5 percent) in June as a result of seasonal factors. Most of this over-the-month gain was provided by the **Specialty Trade Contractors** sector. Between June 2004 and June 2005, **Construction** added 1,000 jobs (+1.6 percent).

## MANUFACTURING FEELS EFFECT OF SEASONAL FACTORS IN JUNE

Statewide **Manufacturing** reported a drop of 2,100 jobs (-1.5 percent) in June, as large seasonal losses in the Oklahoma City MSA overpowered gains elsewhere. The **Durable Goods** sector dropped 1,800 jobs (-1.9 percent), and **Non-durable Goods** provided the rest of the loss. For the year, **Durable Goods Manufacturing** was the only industry sector to report a gain.

## WHOLESALE TRADE LEADS THE CHARGE IN JUNE

**Trade, Transportation and Utilities** added 1,900 jobs (+0.7 percent) in June, as the **Wholesale Trade** sector contributed over half of the gain. The **Retail Trade** and **Transportation, Warehouse and Utilities** sectors also gained jobs for the month. Between June 2004 and June 2005, **Transportation, Warehouse and Utilities** was the only sector to report job losses.

## PROFESSIONAL & BUSINESS SERVICES UP FOR MONTH & YEAR

Although **Professional and Business Services** experienced marginal monthly growth of 800 jobs (+0.5 percent) in June, the industry managed much more substantial growth over the year. Of the 7,100 jobs gained since June 2004, over 5,000 were provided by the **Administrative and Support Services** sector.

## EDUCATION & HEALTH SERVICES ADDS JOBS OVER YEAR

Education and Health Services felt the impact of seasonal education factors in June, dropping 1,000 jobs (-0.5 percent) over the month. In fact, the 2,300-job loss (-12.4 percent) in the **Educational Services** sector more than cancelled out the 1,300-job gain (+0.8 percent) by the **Health Care and Social Assistance** sector. Most of the year-over-year growth came from **Health Care and Social Assistance**.

## LEISURE & HOSPITALITY DOWN FOR MONTH AS FOOD SERVICES & DRINKING PLACES SHEDS JOBS

**Government** across the state fell victim to seasonal factors in June, as employment reflected public schools and universities going on summer break. This loss was shared by **State Government** and **Local Government**. From June 2004 to June 2005, **Government** added 9,300 jobs, an increase of 3.2 percent.

### SEASONAL LOSSES PUSH EMPLOYMENT DOWN IN OKLAHOMA CITY

Oklahoma City **TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** lost 2,600 jobs (-0.5 percent) in June, bringing the year-over-year change to a gain of 11,200 jobs (+2.1 percent). Both the **Goods Producing Industries** and the **Service Providing Industries** contributed to the monthly loss. Many of the losses were seasonal in nature. For example, **Manufacturing** reported a loss of 1,700 jobs (-4.5 percent) over the month, reflecting a seasonal loss seen each year at this time. **Government** also got in on the seasonal act by shedding 3,100 jobs (-2.7 percent) due to public schools and universities breaking for summer vacation.

## PROFESSIONAL & BUSINESS SERVICES GROWS FOR MONTH & YEAR

The Administrative and Support Services sector provided over half of both the monthly and annual growth. ## SEASONAL FACTORS FORCE EDUCATION & HEALTH SERVICES TO SHED JOBS OVER MONTH

Following the pattern seen across the state, Education and Health Services was affected by seasonal factors in June, shedding 100 jobs (-0.1 percent) over the month. The seasonal effect is more easily seen when looking at the Educational Services sector which dropped 700 jobs (-9.2 percent) in June.
